EDITORIAL COMMENT

So Mendel Fisher is to have his banquet after all. The invitation before me says so very plainly. The banquet is to be held on Sunday evening, March 4th, at the Hotel Commodore, in New York, on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of his appointment to the post of Executive Director of the Jewish National Fund. But somehow I still can't believe it. The thing seems incredible.

Why incredible? Certainly not because Mendel Fisher has not done enough to deserve a testimonial dinner of his own. If banquets were given solely as a reward for services rendered or achievements accomplished, Mendel should have gotten at least one banquet a year in the course of the last ten years. As Executive Director of the Jewish National Fund, he has been tireless and incomparably successful. Making a transcontinental tour with a score of stops on the way has been to him a mere bagatelle. He has done it time and time again, delivering speeches, seeing people, making connections, organizing groups, exhorting to further and increased labors in behalf of the Jewish National Fund. He has been a veritable dynamo, working without a stop. And the results could not but be forthcoming. The total sum raised for the JNF in America since 1933, up-to-date, is close to 16 million dollars. Of course, he was fortunate in the leadership of the JNF but I think it is no exaggeration to say that a great deal of this money is due largely to the tireless efforts of Mendel and his staff. Surely, the increase in the proceeds of the JNF since Mendel took over, is nothing short of phenomenal. The amount raised for INF in the year 1934-5, that is the year when Mendel came in, was \$287,846.53. The income of the Jewish National Fund for the last fiscal year, that is October 1, 1943, to September 30, 1944, was \$2,958,269.46. I'll leave it to the mathematicians to figure out the ratio of the increase. To me, it is absolutely staggering. If ever a Zionist official could point to the record and say with pride "you can judge me on my performance," his name is Mendel Fisher.

So then why should it be so incredible that Mendel Fisher would, after these ten years of tireless service and unexampled achievement, be tendered a testimonial dinner? Well, it's because of something in Mendel himself, that makes it hard to believe that he would sit at the head of the table and permit himself to be showered with praise, until very late in the night when all the adjectives as well as the guests are exhausted and all he could do is to mumble his thanks. For Mendel belongs to that category of Jewish communal workers who, for some reason I have never been able to make out, have made it their business to magnify and glorify others while they themselves remain in the shade. There are a number of such workers I know who, for a lifetime, have lent themselves, their abilities, their pens, their speechmaking, their free time, to build up a reputation for some of those who today occupy the top positions in Jewish leadership. Of course, they have believed in those leaders and they have supported them because they were convinced that through them much could be achieved in the interests of the Jewish people. But the strange thing is that while remembering to promote the interests and the greatness of others, these communal workers have altogether forgotten about themselves, their own interests and even their own claim to greatness. Occasionally, it would happen that a great leader, after having climbed to greatness on the shoulders of the communal workers, forgot them too.

Mendel Fisher has spent a lifetime in the service of the Zionist movement. I can remember him singing the praises of, even conducting campaigns for, some of the Zionist moguls. I don't remember his ever conducting a campaign for himself. He has been content to work behind the scenes and let the credit go elsewhere. If ever he saw a man ready to work and give of himself unstintingly, Mendel made sure to back him up, to fall behind him. He has a way of serving enthusiastically. He never wearies of throwing bouquets at those who deserve it. He remains steadfastly loyal to their name and fame. Indeed, loyalty is Mendel's chief and most abiding characteristic. Throughout the years, he has remained unswervingly loyal to the Zionist cause, to his Zionist leaders, to his friends. They have always been uppermost in his mind; he has always remembered them. But very often he has forgotten all about himself.

So I shall be glad to be at Mendel's banquet, to see him sit at the head of the table listening to speeches about himself. Yet, somehow it all seems incredible. To watch Mendel sit at his own banquet instead of running around arranging banquets for others will be a novel experience, and I shall have to pinch myself repeatedly to really believe it.

On Sunday, March 4th, there will be a Dinner for our friend, Mendel N. Fisher, Executive Director of the Jewish National Fund in America, in honor of the Tenth Anniversary of his service. The Arrangements Committee which is headed by Dr. Israel Goldstein and Judge Morris Rothenberg, includes members of all groups and parties who participate in the activities of the Keren Kayemeth. Many other prominent friends throughout the country have also enthusiastically responded and are sponsoring this Dinner.

In many Zionist circles, Mendel Fisher is called "the dynamic driving-force" of the Jewish National Fund. His energies, initiative, and worthy activities, his aggressive grasp of National Fund aspirations, have made many friends for him throughout the country, and have in no small measure brought to prominence the meaning of Jewish National Fund in American Jewish life. His testimonial is therefore deserved, and therefore, everyone will gladly join in public expression of love and acknowledgment of his outstanding work.

In such a large national organization as the Jewish National Fund, it is understood that the Executive Director does not work alone. Together with him there are many deserving, sincere, and active colleagues, each one having a positive share in the program of the large Jewish land-redemption fund. They will all be honored, and their activities acknowledged in the testimonial to Mendel Fisher.

Jewish columnists are calling attention to the fact that Mendel N. Fisher will round out a decade of service to the Jewish National Fund next March. In New England, and especially in Boston, we take pride in the fact that Mr. Fisher is one of our own. His service to the Jewish people, particularly to Palestine, dates back long before he became Executive Director of the J. N. F. His whole life has been devoted to Eretz Israel.

He began to serve the J. N. F. under the presidency of Dr. Israel Goldstein, who has written a glorious page in the history of the Keren Kayemeth. This record is being continued splendidly under the leadership of Judge Morris Rothenberg. Mendel Fisher has been fortunate, indeed, in working with such devoted Zionists. They have furnished, and are still furnishing, matchless inspiration.

Spurred on by these devoted leaders, Mr. Fisher, who is a veritable dynamo, has helped make the J. N. F. a fine instrumentality for land acquisition in Palestine. The year Mr. Fisher was called to this organization the income of the J. N. F. was \$200,397.46. For the ten months of 1943-1944 the income from traditional sources alone is \$1,672,000. That does not include the UPA share of the J. N. F.

Mendel Fisher would be the last person to claim credit for these wonderful results. He would say that it represents the deep devotion of the men and women of all Zionist groups to Eretz Israel. He would, as he always does, insist that the hard working staff of the J.N.F. deserves full credit for what has been accomplished during the time he has managed the business of the Keren Kayemeth.

The fact remains, however, that his ingenuity, his ardent labors, his enthusiasm and down-right hard work as Executive Director had very much to do with what has been accomplished. He never spares himself. That is why he doesn't spare others in this work. Those who have watched the growth of the J.N.F. in the past ten years know that Mendel Fisher has labored in sickness and in health. During his years of service there was depression and riots, war and invasions. Paletine was bombed. Things looked dark and gloomy. Others were ready to give up. But he insisted that for Zionists there can be no let-up, with respect to land redemption in Eretz Israel. By sheer force of character he carried along even those who were ready to give up.

We should like to see suitable recognition given by the Zionists of America, by all parties in Zionism, since the Keren Kayemeth is the instrumentality of all Zionists, to this devoted servant of Israel.

Fisher, Executive Director of the Jewish National Fund, will celebrate with and for him the tenth anniversary of his tenure of that important office. They will do so with keen satisfaction. They know—and American Zionists know—with what ardor, with what tirelessness, with what skill and devotion he has labored for the Keren Kayemeth VYisrael. The decade of his directorship, first under the chairmanship of Dr. Israel Goldstein and now under that of Judge Morris Rothenberg, has been one of unparalleled progress in the sacred task of acquiring land in Palestine as the inalienable property of the Jewish people.
