- I 18th Century ideals of humanism and liberalism. The Encyclopedists in France -- the Rights of Man -- the French Revolution.
- II Even before legal enfranchisement of Jews -- attitude of cultured non-Jews reversed -- Moses Mendelssohn -- Lessing and Nathan the Wise -- essays on improvement of the condition of the Jews -- famous Jewish salons -- tens of thousands of Jews converted. "A cheap ticket of admission" to European life -- Heine -- Disraeli -- Felix Mendelson.
- III Various reactions of Jews to their emancipation
 1. Complete assimilation -- Judaism old-fashioned and a bar to complete equality -- conversion -- the descendants of Mendelssohn and Berlin Jews.
 2. Adjustment rather than assimilation
 - a. Western Europe -- Reform Judaism plus anti-nationalism.
 - b. In Eastern Europe -- the Haskalah -- modernisation plus Jewish nationalism. Little revision of religion -- concentration on modern schools and secular education
- IV Disillusionment with emancipation -- growth of anti-Semitism in Germany -- Bismarck -- reaction and pogroms in Russia after the ascension of Alexander II in 1881 -- beginning great migrations of Jews westward.
- V Rise of Zionism
 1. Moses Hess - 1862
 2. Dr. Pinsker - 1882 -- founding of first Jewish settlements in Palestine -- 1882.
- VI Organization of Political Zionism by Dr. Theodore Herzl following the Dreyfus Affair in France -- the Jewish State -- the first Zionist Congress 1897 -- the Balfour Declaration, November 2, 1917.
