#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Zionist,

Just as we were going to press, I received this letter from Dr. Abba Hillel Silver and wish to share it with you, in place of my usual message:—

May 7, 1947

Dear Friend:

I want to share with you a single aspect of my concern with reference to our prospects at Flushing Meadows at the deliberations of the United Nations.

It is no easy task to create the opportunity for World Jewry to be heard at this forum of world opinion. Our struggles, our sacrifices for democracy, the shocking spectacle of 6,000,000 martyred dead seemingly make little impress upon a calloused civilization. At this moment the prospects of the world are obscured. There is no freedom from the fears which afflicted all peoples during the uneasy truce between the great wars.

Jewry continues to be "ghettoized" at the conference of the nations. Jewry remains behind railings which are equally as forbidding as the closed gates of the Middle Ages. We are "voiceless" while Arab falsehoods are paraded before the nations of the world—Arabs who hid in their tents when catastrophe threatened the world and Jewry rose embattled to the very heights of courage; the same Jews who are soon forgotten.

In this struggle for justice and right for our people, we need the enlistment of our maximum strength. The Jewish Agency for Palestine will be asked for how many enrolled Zionists they speak. We need NOW this "force of numbers." We must speak for you and your neighbors.

I appeal to you to re-enroll and enroll every adult Jew into the ranks of the Zionist Organization of America. Do it now because it can only be helpful in the today of political action, not in any tomorrow.

I know I can count on your cooperation. Let me hear from you in these re-

#### PART OF HAGANAH'S WORK

Defending Our Growing Base in Palestine

FROM THE FAR NORTH to the heart of the southern desert, 23 new colonies were settled in Palestine in the last half year. For each of these new settlements Haganah provided security against attack.

On October 6, 1946, the first major blow was struck in the conquest of the Negev desert area in the extreme south. On that day twelve new settlements were built in as many hours. This single feat, famous as it has now become throughout the world, still merits notice. For it was not merely a campaign against the desert. It was primarily a concrete proof to the British that the Yishuv means to settle hundreds of thousands of Jews in that area.

For some time it had been known that Britain plans to build a large middle-eastern base for her troops in the Negev. Hence her obstinate effort to block Jewish settlement there. It was decided to present the British with a fait accompli. Preparations were made for the operation in full secrecy. A convoy of hundreds of members of Haganah accompanied the one thousand new settlers to guard and help set up the new colonies. By rightfall they were all complete.

In the hills west of Jerusalem on the same day Nvei Ilan was settled by a group of former French Maquis with the help of the Haganah.

South of Jerusalem in the Hebron Hills, Bnei Akiba was established on October 27. It is one of the highest Jewish settlements in Palestine.

Dovrat was settled on October 31 near Mount Tabor.

Four days later on November 3, Neoth Mordecai arose in the Huleh marshes. Here two members of the Haganah who were participating in the operation were killed in an attack by a group of Arabs. Three of the Arabs were also killed. Establishing this colony was a most difficult task, requiring the building of a temporary bridge across the Jordan for the convoy of settlers and building materials.

On November 28, Yehiam was settled in the western Upper Galilee.

Even in the shadow of martial law, on February 7, three new settlements were added in the Negev, Mivtahim, Shorashim, and Alumim. These brought the outpost of the Yishuv to within 20 miles of the Egyptian border.

In the hills of Hebron south of Jerusalem Misela was settled on February 11 by sabras (natives of Palestine).

Yakum was settled in the Sharon Valley north of Tel-Aviv on March 11, and on the same day at the northern tip of the country, Mayan Baruch was founded.

#### DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER

Dr. Silver needs no introduction to American Jewry nor to World Jewry. He is the symbol and standard bearer of their thoughts and actions.

He was born in Lithuania but arrived in America as a child. He became active in the Zionist ranks in his early youth, enrolling as a member of one of the pioneer youth Zionist groups in New York. At the age of 22, he was graduated from the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati. For a short time he served in the pulpit of a Wheeling, West Virginia congregation. A call came to him from Cleveland. He accepted and has been the spiritual leader there for 28 years.

During the first World War, he served as a representative of the United States Government in France for which he was decorated by the French Government for conspicuous service. He was also the sponsor of the first Unemployment Insurance Law in Ohio. He has long been interested in child labor legislation.

Some of his activities are: President of the Zionist Organization of America; Joint Chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council and Chairman of its Executive Committee; Rabbi of The Temple in Cleveland, Ohio; Vice-President of the World Zionist Actions Committee; President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis; Chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency; Founder and first president of the Cleveland Bureau of Jewish Education; and author of several volumes on Jewish history and religion including, "Messianic Speculations of Israel," "Religion in a Changing World" and others. He was awarded honorary degrees by Western Reserve University in 1928 and the Hebrew Union College in 1941.

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver is the man of the hour. Let us all pay him honor by our presence at the Zionist Jubilee Dinner.

He worries about members, collections, committees, speakers for meetings, and now Sponsors. He looks like a nervous prima-donna at the opening of a ZOA general meeting.
