Rabbi:

The synagogue is the sanctuary of Israel. It was born out of Israel's longing for the living God. It has been to Israel throughout his endless wanderings a visible token of the presence of God in the midst of the people. It has shed a beauty that is the beauty of holiness and has ever stood on the high places as the champion of justice and brotherhood and peace. It is Israel's sublime gift to the world. Its truths are true for all men, its love is a love for all men, its God is the God of all men, even as was prophesied of old, My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples. Come then, ye who inherit and ye who share the fellowship of Israel, ye who hunger for righteousness, ye who seek the Lord of Hosts, come and together let us lift up our hearts in worship.

(Congregation rises)

Rabbi: Borchu es Adonoy hamevoroch. Praise ye the Lord, to whom all praise is due.

Praised be Thou, O Lord our God, who formest light and darkness, ordainest good out of evil, bringest harmony into nature and peace to the heart of man.

Great has been Thy love for us and Thy compassion boundless. Our fathers put their trust in Thee and Thou didst teach them the law of life. Be gracious also unto us that we may understand and fulfill the teachings of Thy word. Enlighten our eyes in Thy law that we may cling unto Thy commandments. Unite our hearts to love and revere Thee. We trust in Thee and rejoice in Thy saving power, for from Thee cometh our help. Thou has chosen us and drawn us nigh unto Thee to serve Thee in faithfulness. Joyfully do we lift up our voices and proclaim Thy unity. Praised be Thou, O God, who in Thy love hast called Thy people Israel to serve Thee.

Let us now proclaim the supreme truth of our faith. It is heard round the world. In every crisis of his life, even in the presence of death, has the Jew affirmed his faith in the one and only God. By this he has endured the fury and suffering of the centuries and risen up to a sublime ministry of service. So do we take up the ancient watchword of our fathers which binds generation to generation in an everlasting covenant:

(Congregation rises)

(Congregation is seated)

Congregation and Rabbi: Thou shalt love the Lord, thy God, with all Thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be upon thy heart. Thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt speak of them when thou sittest in thy house, when thou walkest by the way, when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. Thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thy hand, and they shall be for frontlets between thine eyes. Thou shalt write them upon the doorposts of thy house and upon thy gates; That ye may remember and do all My commandments and be holy unto your God.
