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United Jewish Appeal, Morgenthau-Montor controversy, 1949.

Statement to Am. Section
Jan. 3, '49

1. I opposed consideration at the last meeting of the UJA chairmanship by the Jewish Agency on the ground that this matter is not within its competence and that the UPA has not referred this matter to the Jewish Agency for an opinion. This is true not only as regards the competence of the American Section of the Jewish Agency, but as regards the Jewish Agency as a whole.

The UPA is an autonomous body by its constitution and by the agreement which was recently reached with the Committee of Contributors and Workers. The Board of the United Palestine Appeal elects its own officers and executive committee, determines its own administrative budget and all matters of staff personnel, and defines its own rules of procedure. The UPA also has the responsibility for negotiating an agreement with the JDC for the joint campaign of the UJA, subject to the final authority of the head office or head offices concerned and the Executive of the Jewish Agency. From its context and from the discussions which preceded it it is clear this referred exclusively to the matter of allocation of funds and not to administrative or personnel matters.

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At no time in the past did the Jewish Agency intervene in the matter of selecting chairmen or a general chairman for the UJA campaign. This would be tantamount to usurping authority which has not been assigned to the Executive by the Actions Committee or the Congress, nor by the United Palestine Appeal.

2. When the controversy developed around Mr. Monter's resignation and the activities of the Committee of Contributors and Workers the matter was first brought to the attention of the American Section by a communication addressed to it on September 27th by its secretary, Mr. Shulman, who requested that the Agency promptly take steps to reorganize the UPA. The American Section voted in reply to Mr. Shulman, which reply was sent on September 29th, to the effect that "the problem you raise in your letter is in the first instance the concern of the UPA. Questions concerning the organization or reorganization of the UPA should be addressed to the governing body of the UPA for consideration. To our best knowledge your group has made no such approach to the UPA. The American Section of the Jewish Agency for Palestine accordingly suggests that as a matter of procedure your group should direct itself to the UPA and present its ideas to it. Should the UPA desire to consult the Executive of the American Section of the Jewish Agency on this matter they will, of course, hold themselves in readiness at any time for such consultation. You must realize, of course, that the UPA is an autonomous body and that the Jewish Agency for Palestine in no way determines its structure or form of organization."

This has been our consistent line in determining the relationship between the American Section of the Jewish Agency and the UPA. On the same day we notified the Executive in Jerusalem: "No need at this time for intervention Executive Jerusalem or here in matter of Henry's resignation stop UPA will consider matter this week and as yet requested no intervention." Most of the

unpleasantness as between the Executive in Jerusalem and here developed as a result of the hasty action of the Jerusalem Executive in intervening in this situation ahead of the American Section and before the American Section itself had been requested to do so by the UPA. It was the unanimous feeling of this body that the American Section should have the first opportunity to consider such a matter when referred to it, and that no action should be initiated in Jerusalem; furthermore, that spokesmen of the Government of Israel should not intervene in matters which are within the competence of the Jewish Agency.

When the negotiations between the representatives of the UPA and the Committee of Contributors and Workers reached a point where the opinion of the American Section was considered desirable and was accordingly requested, the American Section then discussed at great length and at a series of meetings the proposed agreement. The chairman of the UPA, the UPA negotiators, and at a subsequent stage, the chairman of the Conciliation Committee of the Council for Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds were in attendance at one or all the meetings. The American Section approved of the agreement and later on of the reinstatement of the five executives who had resigned, and so informed the UPA of its recommendation.

At no time did the American Section intervene on its own in this matter, but was pleased and eager to make its good offices available on a matter so vital to the UPA which eagerly solicited the opinion of the Agency. Thus, the autonomy of the UPA was scrupulously respected and the helpful cooperation of the Jewish Agency was not wanting.

3. It has been stated that on the basis of a cable received from the Executive of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem on December 13th the American Section has been given full authority over the UPA, that it can intervene in all matters within the competence of the UPA, and that it can over-ride decisions of the UPA.

In the first place, it should be stated that the cable of December 13th gives no such authority, and in the second place, that the Jerusalem section has no power to grant any such authority. The cable, you will recall, was drafted here by Mr. Locker and was requested by the American Section: a) to re-instate into respectability the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth in the United States which had been subjected by the dissidents to so much hostile criticism, and to uphold the status and authority of these historic Zionist funds; b) to reaffirm that the UPA will continue to function in the future as in the past, as a unifying central fund-raising agency for the upbuilding of Israel; and c) to stress that the "American Section of the Jewish Agency is entrusted now as heretofore with full responsibility for ^{reporting} representing, guiding and supervising all activities on behalf of the Zionist movement and the Jewish Agency on the American scene and all organized effort connected with the upbuilding of Israel."

A re-reading of the discussions which took place at our meetings will indicate that the purpose of this last clause was aimed against the independent efforts which were being made in this country by various groups presumably speaking in the name of some sanctions which they had received from Israel, launching activities on the American scene without consulting the Jewish Agency here, or even in defiance of it. Involved also was the question of multiplicity of campaigns, which problem the members of the American Section have felt right along could not be tackled in any satisfactory manner unless authority was vested in the first instance in the American Section. This cable of December 13th in no way suggests that the rights of existing and long-established Zionist bodies such as the UPA should be curbed or interfered with. I call your particular attention to the words "entrusted now as heretofore with full responsibility." If one wishes to place a broad construction on the wording of this cable, then the phrase "the American Section of the Jewish Agency is entrusted with full responsibility

for reporting (or representing), guiding and supervising all activities on behalf of the Zionist movement on the American scene and all organized effort connected with the upbuilding of Israel," to mean/ the American Section will from now on have the power to supervise all the activities of the Hadassah, the Gewerkshafoten campaign, the ZOA and, of course, all other Zionist activities in the United States, this, I submit, is under the existing constitution utterly unrealistic. Only the action of a Congress can bring about such a radical redistribution of authority in Zionism.

4. As a by-product of the negotiations between the UPA and the JDC for 1949 allocations the JDC thrust prominently to the fore the question of multiplicity of campaigns and the chairman of the UPA, Mr. Weisman, cabled on January 3rd to the Agency in Jerusalem stating that it is imperative that you realize that an agreement with the JDC is impossible without the definitive granting of authority to the American Section of the Jewish Agency to deal with the multiplicity of campaigns. Here again what was involved was not the authority of the UPA, but the question of the many campaigns outside/the UPA which are being conducted in the United States, over which the UPA, of course, has no control. The UPA, therefore, suggested to the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem, inasmuch as many of these campaigns claimed to have the sanction of Jerusalem or of the Government of Israel, to grant the authority to the American Section to deal with the problem in the first instance. In reply to this cable the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem replied on January 5th that with reference to those funds which are recognized by the Congress it can do very little. It, accordingly, suggests that the timing of these campaigns be coordinated by the UPA according to the last year's declarations. With reference to all other campaigns it requests that the American Section should convey whatever declarations and information it has to Jerusalem and that they would take the matter up

with the Government and inform us here of their conclusions, to which, you will recall, we decided to inform the Jerusalem Agency, and this was done on January 16th, that their suggestion is acceptable subject to the following conditions: 1) that all decisions with reference to the multiplicity of campaigns should be by the full Executive, not just the Jerusalem section; 2) that applications by American organizations for certification as bona fide fund-raising organizations should be referred in the first instance to the American Section; and 3) that a statement should be issued in Israel that no new campaign should be started without prior approval of the Jewish Agency and the Government.

You will see clearly that in this matter likewise the authority of the UPA is in no way impinged upon. The question was solely that of sanctioning and co-ordinating independent campaigns on the American scene.

I submit it as my considered judgment that it was a grave mistake for members of the American Section of the Jewish Agency to intervene in the matter of the appointment of a 1949 chairman for the UJA, a subject which is entirely within the competence of the UPA and the JDC. However keenly some members of the Executive may feel about the desirability of this man or that man for the post of general chairman, others on the Executive may have contrary opinion. It was most unfortunate that the judgment of the chairman, who has sought to guide the affairs of the American Section always within the framework of its designated authority, was overruled and that a recommendation made to the UPA by these five members of the Jewish Agency was voted down by the UPA, entailing a loss of prestige to the Jewish Agency, whose authority in such matters, until otherwise ruled by the Congress, lies in voluntary consultation and cooperation, and not in coercion. I submit further that continued attempts to override the UPA or to brush it aside and carry on independent negotiations with the JDC concerning the UJA campaign leadership for 1949 -- a situation in which we have no status whatsoever -- will lead to irreparable confusion and disruption in our ranks and may seriously affect the 1949 campaign.
