



FOREWORD

The 173rd anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence was celebrated on July 4th, 1949. It recalled that in 1776 a radical new form of government was introduced to the world by a courageous group of 55 men who believed that every human being has a God-given right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. It was the birthday of a way of life, we now know as "Americanism".

From the time it was first evolved back in 1787, the Constitution has been the bulwark of freedom and democracy against the forces of dictatorship and tyranny the world around.

These first 55 men, who gathered at Philadelphia to formulate the document, were doing something that never before had been done in the reported history of man. Never before had free men met to decide their destiny and the destiny of a continent. Out of their convention came an idea—"that man owes allegiance to only God and his conscience"—When the bright sun began to rise and the light of self government began to shine in the depressed hearts of humanity the world over—the shouts of free men were beginning to ramble like the thunder of an early summer storm, the breaking of bondage was rising to a mighty crescendo—All this set in motion by 55 men in Philadelphia. Even today, their echoes are resounding by another small group on another continent—Israel—who, like these 55 men, sought to break bondage, seeking peace and freedom, seeking a home, a haven; a land to ever foster and keep alive our mother tongue.

We Americans, who love Freedom, the very basis and the reason for the creation of this great country, should recall the old welcome to the oppressed of which we were so proud to shout many years ago. Let us recall the inscription on our Statue of Liberty, which stands so proudly as the beacon of American idealism, which is:

"Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore,
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed to me;
I lift my lamp beside the golden door."

Do not those words set forth an American policy? The American way of life? Is not that idealism the same as expressed by the handful of homeless people of the State of Israel? Surely, every good American must resolve that this same cause was the same cause confronting those 55 American patriots in 1787.

We have just passed through a war unequalled in history. It claimed a tremendous toll of human life. We hope the world of tomorrow will forget the hardships of the years of past.

Over 800,000 men and women of Jewish faith have served in the wars in which this great country has been engaged, and if ever the cause need be, if ever this great country shall again face a war, the Jewish men and women will respond as willingly in the future as they did in the past, regardless of who the enemy may be.

This marks the 53rd year of this organization, and this journal is dedicated to those men and women who will guide its destiny during the next half century. We salute them and their comrades at arms and Americans of all faiths who defended the ramparts of freedom in the greatest of all wars.



SOMETHING OF INTEREST

More than 2,500,000 veterans of World War II have come out of the service physically handicapped. To their number must be added unknown thousands whose service-connected disabilities are not yet apparent but may crop up later to blight their lives and livelihoods.

It is understandable that the peculiar plight of the veteran is temporarily obscured in the present drive to find jobs and homes.

During the war, physically handicapped civilians performed remarkably in jobs nobody suspected they could do. There is no reason to suppose that disabled ex-servicemen cannot equally well fit into the normal industrial picture of today.

A recent survey conducted by the U. S. Employment Service yields some telling statistics. In a group comprising some 300 employers and 62,283 workers in varied fields, it was proven that 97.2 per cent of the disabled workers were as efficient as their able-bodied colleagues; 7.8 per cent were MORE efficient.

These facts need emphasis and re-emphasis. No veteran need be denied employment because of his handicap.

Adequate care for the veteran, his dependents and the hospitalized veteran has always been one of the principal aims of this organization. Rehabilitation and care of the veteran is the prime objective of our programs formulated by the various Posts of this organization.

Job placement is another important function. Business and industry have found that if the right job is found, the handicapped veteran is at least as good a worker as his companion who has no handicap. Selective placement is the keynote to successful employment of this program.

Compensation claims for service connected disability is based entirely upon the disability. Our organization offers skilled, fully trained personnel to handle veterans claims. Since the Government prohibits any lawyer from charging more than \$10.00 for presenting a veteran's claim, this organization offers free its trained staff.

We have conducted a nationwide campaign urging all veterans to keep their government insurance after discharge from service. This is of vital importance since many veterans may not be eligible for insurance in later years because of their wartime disabilities, and the low cost is something every veteran should take into consideration.

We offer a full and complete veterans program and urge all veterans to take advantage of our services.

TO instill love of Country and Flag and to promote sound minds and bodies in our members and our youth.


