Our kind Father in Heaven, upon all who are gathered here, we invoke Thy blessing. It is for the glory of Thy name and for the service of the fellowship of all Thy children that these men and women have assembled here, prompted by the desire to advance a common brotherhood and by the need to defend a common heritage.


