THE DENISON CHAPEL SERVICE

The Denison weekly chapel service is the only regular occasion when the entire student body and faculty meet together as the Denison Family. It is a religious service wherein we are invited to recognize the claims which the Christian faith makes upon us. If the Denison chapel service fulfills its fundamental purpose, over the months it will aid each one of us, students and faculty members, to discover more clearly what he believes; it will invite him to dedicate and re-dedicate his life to the finest and highest which he can comprehend.

The chapel has the additional purpose of reminding us all that we belong to a campus community. By tradition, routine announcements are excluded but it has seemed appropriate to make room for those materials in the current life of the College that will keep us aware of the ongoing life of our campus. In a word, the chapel is intended to symbolize uniquely the experience of belonging to and sharing in Denison at its best.

For these reasons regular chapel attendance is expected of all students. For the second semester of 1950-51 nineteen regular chapel services have been planned; in addition there will be two or three extra assemblies at which attendance is taken. A record of attendance will be kept and you will be given credit toward graduation if you attend at least fifteen of these services. There is no system of excuse from chapel. If for legitimate reasons such as illness, you are unable to attend the minimum number of services, you will not receive credit but the fact of your illness will be noted in your personnel record. If for other reasons you do not attend with sufficient regularity to gain credit, this fact will be noted in your personnel record and will have a bearing upon your future standing at Denison.

Please bear in mind that the chapel service is an important and integral part of our Denison program and to make it fully successful we need your hearty cooperation.
