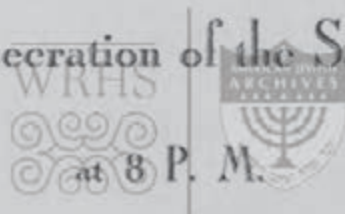

DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER, who will deliver the Dedication Sermon, is serving his thirty-fifth year as Rabbi of the Temple in Cleveland, Ohio. He is the foremost American Rabbi and generally considered one of the outstanding religious leaders of our time.

DR. ASA S. KNOWLES is the ninth President of the University of Toledo. He is a former Vice-President of Cornell University. Although new in his present post, our University has already taken great strides forward in his administration.

REV. C. CLARK SHEDD has been for a number of years the Executive Secretary of the Toledo Council of Churches. Noted for his administrative ability, the Council, under his direction, has become a potent force in the life of our community.

Mr. Lewis N. Osterman, Vice-President of the Temple and Chairman of the Expansion Program, will present the completed building to the Temple, and Mr. Norman Thal, President of the Congregation, will give the address of acceptance.

Rabbi Feuer will conduct the Service and offer the Prayer of Dedication. The Invocation will be given by Mr. Melbourne Harris and the Benediction by Dr. Morton Goldberg, Rabbi of B'nai Israel Congregation.

An augmented Temple Choir of eight voices under the direction of Mr. J. Harold Harder, Music Director, will provide a beautiful and impressive musical setting for the Dedication Service.

A Reception and Open House in Kobacker Hall will follow the Service, giving members and guests an opportunity of inspecting the completed building.

It is suggested that members of the Temple come as early as possible so as to facilitate the work of the Usher Corps.

Prior to the Service next Friday evening, the Board of the Temple is holding a Dinner in honor of the participants in the Service at 6 P. M. in the Hillcrest Hotel.

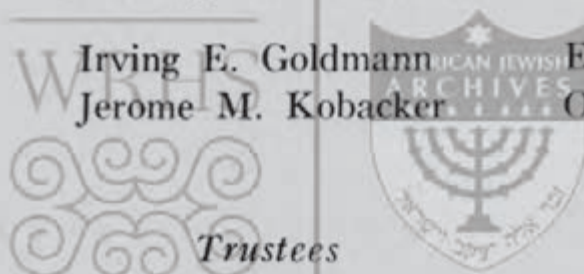

History of the Temple



The Scottwood Temple

ON MAY 2nd, 1950, the annual dinner meeting of the congregation was held at the Commodore Perry Hotel. This was an historic occasion, celebrating our Seventy-Fifth Anniversary. After reviewing the events and accomplishments of the past, the congregation announced a momentous decision.

The story of the congregation, as written by Mrs. Irving E. Goldmann, and published in the Anniversary Program, told of the early days and struggles, and of the original group who were active in its organization—Mr. and Mrs. Solomon Wiler (grandparents of the present President of our Sisterhood, Mrs. Robt. Zimmerman), Jacob LaSalle, Isaac Landman, Leopold Franc, S. H. Frank, Julius Mack, Nathan L. Ries, Joseph Roth and Benjamin Frankenberg.

The first Temple was built in 1884 and was served in turn by the following rabbis—B. Eger, Tobias Schanfarber, E. H. Browne, Emanuel Schreiber, Julius Meyer, Charles Freund and David Alexander.

A short stay in a building located on Scottwood Avenue near Bancroft was followed by the construction of our present Temple building at Collingwood and Acklin. Although completed more than 35 years ago, the architecture of this building is still regarded as modern. The lay leaders of the congregation at the time of the completion of this structure were—Charles K. Friedman, President; Isidor Silverman, Vice-President; Leon Netzorg, Secretary; Maurice Mcyer, Treasurer; and Trustees A. S. Cohen, Abe Koch, Morris Rosenberg, Edwin M. Rosenthal and Morris H. Lempert. Since then the following have served as Presidents of the congregation, Manuel R. Cohn, Oscar J. Smith, Sam Davis, Jerome Kobacker, Dr. A. L. Steinfeld, J. Eugene Farber, Earl M. Rosengarten and Norman Thal, the present incumbent of the office.

Spiritual leaders of the Temple since the completion of the present structure have been Rudolph I. Coffee, 1919-1921; Samuel J. Harris, 1921-1924;

Several weeks prior to the anniversary dinner, a special congregational meeting had voted unanimously to embark upon an ambitious program for the expansion of its physical facilities, and the machinery set in motion to raise the funds and to formulate the building plans. It is interesting to contrast the difference between the early days of the congregation's history and the present. In the year 1879 it was decided to attempt to raise \$12,500 for the building erected in 1884. It was quite an undertaking, and those early pioneers deserve a tremendous amount of credit for their achievement. Their planning was for a relatively new movement called Reform Judaism. Not many then sensed the need for such a development on the American scene.

In 1950, Reform Judaism was a tremendously vital and flourishing movement. The evidence in Toledo was the pressing need for a sizeable addition

to the present Temple requiring the expenditure of \$250,000. The various committees approached their respective tasks with enthusiasm. A campaign for funds was launched, and the result we see in the newly enlarged and redecorated Temple which stands on the block-long site between Acklin and Winthrop streets on Collingwood Boulevard. The speed with which the project was realized is attested to by the fact that the cornerstone was laid on April 29th, 1951, in connection with the seventy-sixth Annual Meeting, and the Dedication Service held January 25th, 1952, a little more than a year and a half since the Seventy-Fifth Anniversary was celebrated.

This handsome souvenir program, published in connection with the Dedication, is the successful project of the Temple Brotherhood. As Co-Chairmen in charge were Edward B. Arenson and Sol Treuhaft. Irvin Ecelstein rendered valuable help in the editing of the book.

THE MAIN STRUCTURE of the Collingwood Avenue Temple, though built some 35 years ago, has such a modern and contemporary feeling, that it was felt the repetition of the original Temple motives and lines could be incorporated into the new addition and create a building which will be modern and complimentary to these times. The new brick and stone will in time darken and age in appearance making the new and old structures blend as a single unit.

The main problem presented to the Architects was to provide additional seating for the High Holy Days and to accommodate an increasing membership, without making major structural changes and expenditures. Also to provide good lighting and a suitable Ark for the main sanctuary.

The first problem was solved by breaking through part of the north wall of the main Temple for the Chapel and Auditorium. These rooms are divided by folding doors, which, when opened, provide a clear vista to the pulpit in the main Temple. These two rooms will seat 300 to 400 for dinner and many more can be seated theatre style.

The lighting problem was solved by adding recessed lights and spot lights in the main sanctuary.

The old Ark was re-worked and re-faced with oak panels similar in character to the pulpit and other Temple furniture. The Ten Commandments were carved into a wood panel and finished to resemble stone. New lighting was provided in the Ark and above it.

In the new addition, immediately inside the Winthrop Street entrance is a spacious foyer, off which are the administrative offices and lounge.

The Rabbi's study and new library are located off the main corridor. Here also are the rest rooms and storage rooms. The former vestry room and offices were converted into six new class rooms and a corridor which connects with the new corridor. The class rooms have been provided with new lighting and decorated in pastel colors in shades of green. The floor coverings here and in the corridor are darker shades of green and grey in asphalt tile.

The vestry room has been provided with a large stage and sound system. The color scheme in this room and the chapel are in soft shades of rose beige which makes a neutral background for any future decorative scheme.

Adjoining the Chapel and new Auditorium is the new kitchen, which is the last word in efficiency. The equipment and facilities provided makes this one of the outstanding kitchens in the city. It was scientifically planned and laid out to eliminate steps and take the drudgery out of kitchen work. This kitchen has its own separate entrance, service area and off-street parking for deliveries.

A new heating and ventilating system has been installed.

THE ARCHITECT, Herman H. Feldstein, and Nelson E. Thal, associate architect, the general contractor, Stanford E. Thal, William Ferrell, the heating and plumbing contractor, and the Romanoff Electric Co., in addition to all the sub-contractors, had a sincere desire to build the finest facilities that could be had for our Temple, and this was accomplished at a cost which came within the original estimates. The Collingwood Avenue Temple Brotherhood

THE HISTORY of the Collingwood Avenue Temple Brotherhood is a story without written record. It exists in the memories of those men who enjoyed this brotherly association.

Joe Ringold recalls a meeting of May 12, 1924 commemorating the farewell to Rabbi Samuel J. Harris. At that time the organization was known as the Men's Club and was led by presidents King Baer, Howard Jacobson, Bert Hebenstreit, Leslie Thal and Lester Alexander. Stanley Friedman presided at the meeting in 1925 when Father James O'Toole, prominent Catholic priest, addressed the Club. Rabbi David Alexander, who preceded Rabbi Rudolph Coffee, was the principal speaker at another. Thomas Kaplin was the president previous to this, and Milton Silverman succeeded this administration.

The Men's Club was followed by the Collingwood Avenue Temple Brotherhood, which came to life in 1935, the year the congregation welcomed Rabbi Leon Feuer. J. Eugene Farber was president at the meeting when Count Rosso, who was billed as an Italian nobleman, electrified the audience. The "Count" was merely a good Broadway actor.

During the administrations of Earl Rosengarten, Harold Green and Louis Michael, the Collingwood Avenue Temple Boy Scout troop was sponsored and financially supported. Troop 37, under the leadership of Jules Housman and Louis Michael, became one of the leading troops in the area.

Lawrence Broh-Kahn chaired meetings addressed by such prominent people as Sir Norman Angell and Frank Kingdom.

During the war (and meat rationing) Lewis N. Osterman added spice to the meetings by serving meals at 79c per plate. These meals were prepared and served by the Brotherhood's own kitchen crew, including Lester D. Alexander, Harry and Larry Jacobs, Harvey Fain, Dr. Jerome Jacobson, Sam Fine, John Hirsch, and Irving Goldmann.

Seymour Mindel, Norman R. Thal, and Harvey Fain continued to provide good programs that attracted a membership that numbered more than 500 men. The very popular Father-Son and Father-Daughter Banquets were inaugurated.

In 1947, when Dr. Jerome Jacobson was president, Professor Walter Burg of the University of Toledo, presented an instructive talk on Atomic Energy.

The next season, under the administration of Milton Ackerman, the Brotherhood combined with the Sisterhood to sponsor Celia Adler, First Lady of the Yiddish Stage.

Sydney Friedlander was able to introduce the Governor of Ohio, Frank J. Lausche, at a meeting the following season. David Mostov was president in 1950 when the Bowling League was formed. This activity has grown into a group of some 50 couples.

This year's president, Dr. Robert Zimmerman, has his group working on the dedication of the new Temple. A Cub Pack has been organized to interest the younger boys. Famous fisticuffer Barney Ross and Hal Block of television fame were presented at recent meetings.

Throughout its history, the Brotherhood has contributed financial support to the Temple Bulletin. Collingwood Avenue Temple Brotherhood has always provided the men of the Congregation with comradeship that has been both helpful and enjoyable. Other officers are Irvin Mindel, Vice-President; Stanford E. Thal, Secretary, and Roy Treuhaft, Treasurer.

The Collingwood Avenue Temple Sisterhood

THE SISTERHOOD of Collingwood Temple is proud of its long history of service to our Congregation. Since the very founding of the Congregation in 1875, there always has been an active women's organization of the Temple, interested in promoting its welfare. Soon after our "Founding Fathers" held their historic meeting in the American Express Company office on Summit Street, their wives met to organize the Temple Ladies Auxiliary for the purpose of stimulating interest in Congregational life, improving the place of worship, and establishing a Religious School wherein their children might learn the principles of Reform Judaism. Although there are no available records of these early meetings, we know the organization prospered and did much to further the religious, philanthropic, cultural, and social activities of the Congregation, always on the alert for any service to or for the Temple.

When the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods was founded over 40 years ago, this Temple Ladies Auxiliary was one of the first units to join its ranks, and in accordance with the National Federation's recommendation, changed its name, and became known as the Sisterhood of the Temple. When the Ohio State Federation of Temple Sisterhoods was formed in 1919, as a link between the local and national organizations, Collingwood Temple Sisterhood was one of its charter members.

During the course of the years, the Sisterhood has given much financial support to the Temple. Time and again in the tiny Temple on Tenth Street, and later in the Scottwood Avenue Temple, and even in the early days on Collingwood, the Sisterhood was called upon to help meet a deficit in the budget of the Temple, and always responded to the demands made upon it, by means of many successful fund raising projects. The most memorable fund raising project in its history, however, was the Bazaar held 30 years ago in the old Coliseum on Ashland Avenue, at which time the Sisterhood raised over \$14,000 to alleviate the mortgage on the Temple.

When the Congregation built its present Temple, it was one of the Sisterhood members, Mrs. Herbert Davies, who insisted upon the purchase of a truly fine organ for the new building, instead of the inexpensive one specified in the original plans. Accordingly, the Sisterhood undertook the project and raised the \$6,000 necessary to purchase the fine instrument which so enhances the beauty of our services. At this same time, the Sisterhood also purchased the carpeting and lighting fixtures for the main auditorium of the new building. The Sisterhood has always provided kitchen equipment, china, glassware, linens, etc., for the Temple's use whenever the need for such things arose. Today, the Sisterhood is engaged in projects to raise the \$25,000 which it pledged to the Temple Building Fund, for the purpose of building and equipping the new kitchen in our beautiful new building.

The Religious School has always been dear to the heart of the Sisterhood and for years was its sole support. Today, through its Religious School Committee, the Sisterhood sponsors the Parent-Teachers' Association of the school, and each year furnishes record books to the Consecrants, Chanukah candles and Menorahs to the children, and Bibles to the Confirmants.

The Sisterhood has been a strong cultural influence in our Congregational life through its fine monthly programs, study groups, and Book Review Series. It also has done much to promote good communal relations through its Interfaith Programs.

Through the years the Sisterhood has enjoyed fine leadership and is very fortunate to have so many of its Past Presidents still active and interested in its work. Today it is led by Mrs. Robert Zimmerman, president; Mrs. Sidney Leach, first vice-president; Mrs. Edward Arenson, second vice-president; Mrs. Merwin Berenson, recording secretary; Mrs. Sanford Green, corresponding secretary; Mrs. E. Manuel Fox, treasurer; Mrs. Irwin Thal, financial secretary; and is carrying on the Sisterhood tradition of service to the Temple.

The Temple Junior League

THE HISTORY of the Junior League is a sketchy one as records are not available. During the 1920's, there was a very active group of young people who met periodically at the Temple for social events. There developed, sometime later, a high school group, that met for lectures and dances.

Shortly after Rabbi Feuer came to Toledo this group was reorganized. It became known as the "Junior League." Its purpose was to serve as a link between confirmants and The Temple, offering religious, educational, and social events.

In the past few years, this group has been very active and successful in achieving these goals. The programs each year have included, among other things, an Interfaith Dinner attended by groups of young people from neighboring churches, a panel of parents and Junior League members discussing teen age problems, and a party welcoming confirmants.

These young people have contributed to the building fund by waiting tables at Temple functions. During the past two summers, representatives of the Junior League, sponsored by the Sisterhood and Brotherhood, have attended National Federation of Temple Youth camps. These conclaves have served both inspirationally and informatively.

The present group is led by Larry Charnas, president; Judy Krawetz, vice president; Leita Klein, secretary, and Tommy Klein, treasurer. The advisors are Mr. and Mrs. Donald Rothschild and Mr. and Mrs. Roy Treuhaft.

The importance of this group cannot be stressed enough. These young people are the future members of the Temple. The Junior League is the only channel through which they can continue their formal religious education and contacts until they become members of the Temple and its auxiliary organizations.

Interfaith Activity

COLLINGWOOD AVENUE TEMPLE is rightly proud of the fact that as a pioneer in this field in the community, we have for a number of years sponsored an excellent and constructive program of public relations in the area of interfaith education. This program has included splendidly attended Institutes on Judaism for Clergy and University Teachers, Sisterhood and Brotherhood Institutes on Judaism for the Christian laity and several fine interfaith programs for young people sponsored by the Temple Junior League. Believing this to be one of the significant aspects of its work in the community, the Temple plans to continue and expand this program in the years to come.

Hebrew Education

In cooperation with the Toledo Bureau of Jewish Education, the Temple operates a Week Day Hebrew Department under the direction of Mr. Morris Horowitz. The Department has an excellent enrollment.

Two years ago the Ceremony of Bar Mitzvah was introduced on a voluntary basis and has proven exceedingly popular.

The Temple Religious School

HOW WELL any congregation will continue to serve its people year after year depends upon the quality of education offered to its children. The founders of the Collingwood Avenue Temple Religious School realized this when, in 1884 in the little building on Tenth Street the first religious school classes were held. The present leaders of our congregation have kept this purpose constantly in their minds in planning the structure now being dedicated.

From the handful of children who in 1884 shared their school room with the building's furnace, until 1935 when 150 children were enrolled, the school grew steadily with each forward step of the Temple.

However, it was not until 1935, the year Rabbi Feuer became our spiritual leader, that the Temple Religious School, completely reorganized under his guidance, started on its way to becoming one of the finest religious schools in any comparably sized city in the United States. This year some 400 children are enrolled, 52 of them forming the largest kindergarten class in the Temple's history.

The objective of our educational program is to enrich the lives of our children with a knowledge of the Jewish faith and to impart an understanding and appreciation of their heritage, thereby helping them to build a satisfying philosophy and implanting in them a sense of security, status and of belonging as Jews and Americans.

With this objective in mind a curriculum planned to meet the needs of children is carefully employed. The school is divided into three departments, the Primary and Intermediate meeting on Sunday morning and the Junior High School on Saturday morning. Each department with its varied activities, projects and class room work has its own religious service each week. Even the youngest children are given a personal sense of religion when they repeat their simple prayers and responses during their own services.

The most modern and effective methods are used from the simple textbook and workbook to such elaborate audio-visual aids as slide projectors, recordings and motion pictures. And the curriculum is offered warmly in a fine Jewish atmosphere created by the religious services, by the singing of traditional music, by the study of Hebrew in the Intermediate and Junior High departments, and the appropriate observance of all the Jewish Festivals, whether by an elaborate Family Candlelight Service on Chanukah or a costume parade on Purim.

The Temple Religious School sets high standards for members of its faculty. Every member of the staff is not only a trained and experienced teacher but has the added quality of a sincere belief in the school's objectives and a deep desire to impart this to the pupils.

Mrs. Florence Mirsky is the Educational Director and is assisted by Dr. Sidney Robbin, Mrs. Paul Belkin, Mrs. Henry Hartman, Miss Sarah Tarloff, Miss Marilyn Cannen, Mrs. Marshall Lipman, Miss Beverly Manoff and Mrs. Howard Schwab. Miss Margot Herz is a student teacher. Mrs. Leo Krawetz is school secretary.

The Hebrew Department, in charge of Morris Horowitz, Hebrew Supervisor, is staffed by Albert Maleson, Joseph Siletski, Mrs. Helen Pertcheck, Shlomo Micznik, Miss Regina O'Hara, and Jay Glassman. Miss Sylvia Godfrey is in charge of school music and Mrs. Irving Rudinger, special programs.

After many years of maintaining high standards in spite of the handicap of lack of adequate facilities, the children and staff of the Temple Religious School rejoice in the splendid, well lighted classrooms, the beautiful auditorium, chapel and lounges, the use of which they will enjoy through their religious school days.

The facilities now available at the Temple have already permitted the housing of a daily Nursery School for three and four year olds, and plans are in the making to extend the educational system to include courses for young people of post-confirmation age and for young parents whose religious knowledge should be refreshed to make their homes reflect the Jewish ideals and values taught in the school.

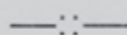

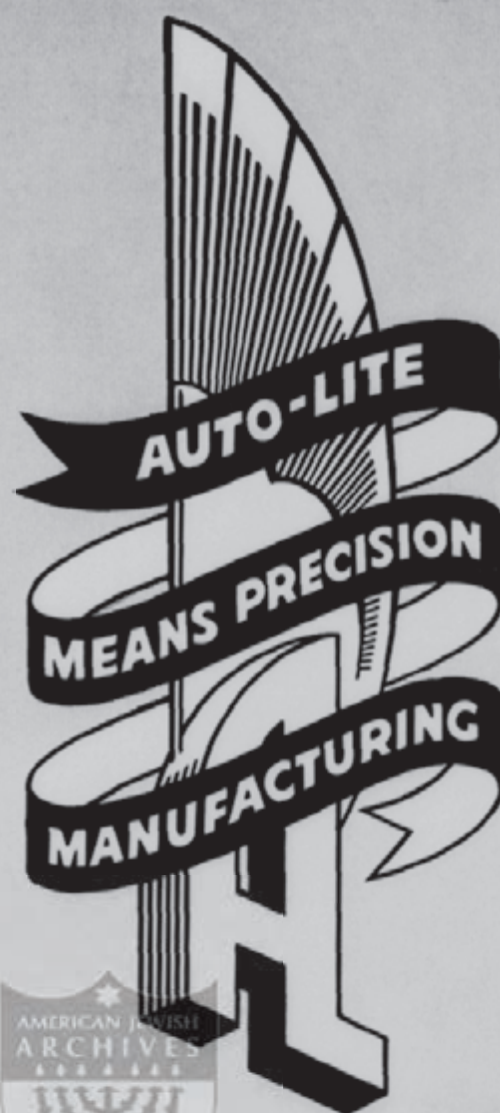
