ABBA HILLEL SILVER of Christians of feus Oct 17, 1952

One of the most significant contributions to brotherhood was made by the National Conference of Christians and Jews in the last quarter of a century. It was providential that in these 25 years of world upheaval, dangerous tensions and threatening spiritual collapse, there was in existence an organization such as the National Conference of Christians and Jews, dedicated to healing and reconciliation, to better understanding and cooperation.

It is clear then even today that all men of good will must unite their forces in urgent defense of their common spiritual heritage which is still being threatened. They must never accept the idea of inevitable and irrepressible conflicts between religions, races, nations or economic systems.

Jews and Chrtians and men of all other faiths have work to do in the world, not merely as citizens of their countries, but as adherents of historic and prophetic faiths whose mission it has always been to teach men to rise above the levels of limitations of system, class, nation, or race to the high levels of humanity, to an eager and out-reaching cooperativeness in the building of the good society on earth, where man's high hopes for justice, freedom and peace can find at last their happy anchorage.

The call issued by the Commission on Religious Organizations of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, and the earnest endorsement given to it by the President of the United States, draw attention to the seriousness of the problem of racial conflicts which has been heightened by events in recent months. American citizens of deep religious conviction and loyalty to the historic traditions of America should do their utmost to keep the situation from getting out of hand. The prestige of our country and the effectiveness of its leadership in the world today depend in a very large measure upon the manner in which the issues of brotherhood and basic human equality are net.
