

I want to extend to the Dublin Jewish Progressive Congregation the hearty felicitations of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the congratulations of your 450 sister Liberal congregations on the North American continent on this happy occasion of dedication and long-awaited realisation.

It is an awesome and stirring moment upon which you pause, a time for personal rededication and deep introspection. The Biblical Book of Leviticus enjoins the builders of the new sanctuary that "fire shall be kept burning upon the altar continually, it shall never be extinguished." The rabbis, in commenting upon this passage tell us that it was the wont of the entire household of Israel to set aside, on a designated day, the mundane routine of their lives and to gather wood so that the altar fire would never be dimmed.
