





Dear Fellow Congregant:

One of many purposes we hope to accomplish in this 100th Anniversary year of Temple Israel is the raising of a \$50,000 fund to meet some of our most pressing needs.

Some necessary repairs must be made to the Temple property which cannot be made from our yearly operating income without incurring a deficit. Our Temple was built thirty-eight years ago at a cost of approximately \$150,000. (Today it would cost in excess of \$500,000 to replace, not including the new Sunday School Building.) This sizeable investment must be protected from deterioration. Reasonable expenditures now will make it unnecessary to spend much larger sums later.

Improvements are also needed at our Congregational Cemetery, which historically is older than the Congregation itself. It is a lasting trust, and in memory of our stalwart predecessors we must keep that trust.

Part of the fund will be used to repay the Temple's bank loans, in order that the Congregation can start its second Century clear of all indebtedness.

As a part of our 100th Anniversary program, a beautiful booklet will be published, giving the highlights of our Temple's first 100 years. One of these commemorative booklets will be given to each member of the Congregation and we feel certain it will be treasured by all.

In honor of our 100th Anniversary, an all day Institute for the Christian Clergy, Religious School Teachers, and Theological Students will be held. This Institute promises to be a real contribution to better understanding in the community as a whole.

The Centennial fund will be raised entirely by volunteer subscription. Our goal is 100% participation by every member of the Congregation, each according to his or her own dictates.

Now is the time. One hundred years of historic growth have demonstrated our leadership in American Judaism. The second 100 years are even more important. Let us perform our service now, in this tangible manner, so those who follow in our footsteps will know of our devotion.

With loyalty and generosity we cannot fail!


