The greatest single achievement of Dr. Hill's administration has been the organization of the Wilberforce University Foundation and Development Fund, duly incorporated in 1956 under the laws of the State of Ohio. It is the belief of Dr. Hill that through the efforts of the philanthropic spirits who constitute the personnel of the Foundation, Wilberforce University will achieve the degree of financial stability that is requisite for maximum efficiency in higher education.

AIMS OF WILBERFORCE UNIVERSITY

As a Christian institution, Wilberforce University is concerned with the highest development of personality for the student through a broad education, specialized training, and a philosophy of life based on sound personal and social values. To this end, the student is encouraged:

- (1) to develop Christian ideals of character and service;
- (2) to interpret the funded knowledge of the human race;
- (3) to comprehend the integration of the various areas of human knowledge;
- (4) to use the English language with proficiency;
- (5) to read a modern language, with reasonable facility;
- (6) to be competent in performing practical mathematical computations;
- (7) to utilize the scientific method, in all life activities;
- (8) to maintain sound mental and physical health;
- (9) to become acquainted with and appreciative of Negro life and achievement, viewed through the perspective of world patterns;
- (10) to make a wise and valid choice of a vocational career and prepare thoroughly tor a vocation.


