Israel's 10th anniversary, 1958.

I have attended several functions in recent weeks in celebration of Israel's Tenth Anniversary.

Two have given me especial pleasure: The Celebration which I was privileged to witness in Israel — and your celebration here this evening.

I need not tell you that the celebration in Israel was profoundly moving and exalting - a grateful people pouring out its deepest emotions in one glorious, unprecedented Hallelujah for its freedom, its independence, its achievements, its confident hopes for the future.

I shared with them fully in their mood of ______in their joy, their pride and thanksgiving.

I am also very happy in this celebration which the Cleveland Jewish Community has arranged this evening.

For our community has had a genuine share in the establishment and the development of the State of Israel in the last decade — and is warranted in sharing also in the joy, the pride and the thanksgiving.

Devoted men and women in this community have through the years, given of their energies and substance to bring the State into existence - to expand its economy - to build and maintain its institutions.

Many of them labored loyally through the unrewarding years - long before the State was established - when the dream seemed unreal and the difficulties insurmountable.

Cleveland lay and spiritual leaders have, with rare exceptions, been the warm friends of a Reborn Israel - and our people as a whole have been commendably generous in providing the brick and mortar for the building of the State - the financial support!

What was it that happened ten years ago that causes us to celebrate the event ten years later, that will be a source of glad and grateful commemoration for all future time? If I were asked what has the State of Israel achieved for us - for our people outside of Israel?, I would say:

These last ten years have restored to our people its lost pride, the confidence which the cruel centrules almost succeeded in destroying. The last ten years saved us from fatal despair after the Nazi horrors which caused the spirit of our people to languish, almost unto death. These last ten years have healed us and made us whole again. They have restored to us the sense of national worth and national mission. History has led us back after many dangerous and desperate detours to the royal highway of our national destiny.

Is our work done after these ten magnificent, exciting, heroic years? Our work will not be done until the ingathering of refugees is completed, until the national economy of Israel is stabilized, until its borders are made secure and its enemies cease from threatening and harassment.

Many difficult problems lie ahead. Problems of economics — an unfavorable marked part of unreconciled neighbors — the large-scale arming of its potential enemies, the competing interests of world powers in the Near East. Many dangers may lie in the offing. But as a people, we are imured to crisis and dangers and difficulties. Our movement has known how to mount upon the rungs of frustration and alternate exhiberation and depression to victory.

I am confident that in the future also, both our cause and our historic sense as well as our resolute will, will sustain us throughout all the unpredictable years.

On October 13, 1986 Dr. Theodore Herzl worte in his "Diaries"

"I must frankly admit to myself: I am demoralized. From no side, help; from every side attacks. Nordau writes me that nobody stirs any longer in Paris. The Maccabeans in London are more Pickwickian than ever... In Germany I have only opponents. The Russians look on sympathetically while I slave away, but none of them lends a hand... The prosperous Jews are all against me..."

And on December 20th of the same year he wrote in his "Diaries":

"I feel that I am growing exhausted. Oftener than ever I believe that my movement is at an end. While I am still absolutely convinced of its feasibility, I cannot overcome its initial difficulties".

And yet, on September 3, 1897, following the first Zionist Congress in Basle, he wrote:

"If I were to sum up the Gongress in a word — which I shall take care not to publish — it would be this:— At Pasle I founded the Jewish State!

If I said this out loud today I would be greeted by universal laughter. In five years perhaps, and certainly in 50 years, every one will perceive it."

(He missed his guess by exactly eight months — for in May 1948 the State of Israel was proclaimed.)
