



ADDRESS..... Very Rev. William J. Kenneally, C.M.



THE REV. EDWIN T. DAHLBERG has been a nationally prominent Protestant leader since the 1940s. He has served two terms as president of the American Baptist Convention and one term as president of the American Baptist Home Mission Society. He was a delegate of the American Baptist Convention to the assembly of the World Council of Churches in Amsterdam in 1948 and in Evanston, Ill., in 1954. He has been pastor of the Delmar Baptist Church of St. Louis, Mo., since 1950. Dr. Dahlberg is the author of two books, "Youth and the Homes of Tomorrow" and "Which Way for a Christian?" He holds a bachelor of divinity degree from the Rochester (N.Y.) Theological Seminary and a doctor of divinity degree from Keuka College in Keuka Park, N.Y.

THE VERY REV. WILLIAM J. KENNEALLY, C.M., is well known in Denver, where he served for 19 years on the faculty of St. Thomas Seminary. He was rector of the seminary for nine years and was also professor of sacred scripture, Greek and Hebrew. Father Kenneally is now rector of St. John's Seminary, Camarillo, Calif., serving also as professor of sacred scripture. He holds a doctorate in theology from the Collegio Angelico, Rome, and a baccalaureate in sacred scripture from Rome's Biblical Institute. A member of the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians), Father Kenneally was ordained a Catholic priest in 1935 in Los Angeles, his native city. He is prominent as a scripture scholar, speaker and teacher.





RABBI ABBA HILLEL SILVER for 42 years has been the spiritual leader of The Temple in Cleveland, the largest liberal Jewish congregation in the United States. Actively identified with many social movements, he was an early champion of the rights of organized labor and one of the first advocates of unemployment insurance in this country. A world leader of Zionism, he has served as chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency for Israel, chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council and president of the Zionist Organization of America. Dr. Silver is the author of several books on history and religion. A graduate of the Hebrew Union College, he was ordained in 1915. In 1958 he received the Human Relations Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.
