Dear Rabbi Silver: -

My wild Irish friend, Casey, Secretary of the Harrisburg Chamber of Commerce, has been in communication with me regarding your contemplated visit to Harrisburg on April 23rd, and this morning advises me that you have been kind enough to express a willingness to include Allentown on the same trip.

I take it from Mr. Casey that you expect to address a noon meeting in Harrisburg on the 23rd. 

Dear Doctor Silver:

I am terribly unhappy to hear, as I did over the telephone this morning, that you are confined to your bed with a heavy cold. I sincerely hope that you will be up very soon and enjoy a complete recovery.

My purpose in telephoning you was to extend an invitation to you to speak at a luncheon my Congregation is giving to the Christian Clergy and lay leaders on either the 5th or 12th of April, at your convenience. Last year, you remember, I invited you to speak at our first Institute on Judaism. I sincerely hope this year you will be able to come. The luncheon will take place at 12 noon, to be followed by an informal exchange of information between you and the Clergy in the afternoon.

The matter is urgent because of this reason: I had invited my old friend the newly-elected President of Union Theological Seminary, Pitt Van Dusen, to speak from my pulpit February 15th or 22nd, at our Annual Brotherhood Service. He is unable to come then, but suggests April 5th or 12th as alternative dates. On thinking the matter over, it occurred to me that it would be a grand thing if you could deliver the "Jewish" message at noon and in the afternoon, and have Pitt deliver the "Christian" message in the evening. This community needs both of you -- badly. The Institute on Judaism was the first public discussion of Judaism, I was told, in the memory of most people here. This is a "medieval" community in that most Christian Clergyman retain the same kind of mind the spiritual leaders held in those far-away times. The lines here are tightly drawn. If anywhere the "Ghetto" gegins at 6 P. M., surely it does here! I speak of these confidential matters because I want you to know this is a terribly important spot for our work. I need your help. Will you extend it to me?

It was a joy to have talked to you over the telephone last week. Thank you very much for your kindness and for your helpfulness. Gladys joins me in every good wish to you, Virginia and the boys.
