Vesper swrvice, if you had to return that night. otherwise, we would have it at night. I like to secure from the various churches, am liberal myself, and our people are, and I would be very glad. indeed, if this could be arranged. I was acquainted with Rabbi Greis, and frequently heard him. If you could so plan. (we are on the C. & S. W. Elec) fore some time later in winter or spring, I shall be pleased to hear from you.
