We think of men today almost invariably in relation to their business or professions. We should think of them rather in relation to their leisure. For it is in his leisure hours that a man can be a creative amateur. Our industrialized civilization demands specialization, which tends to narrow one's mental and spiritual life. Most of us have only one world in which to live - the world of our vocations. For the purpose of earning a living that is admirable. For the purpose of earning life - it is fatal.

We have not enough amateurs in our society - men, who out of sheer love of life, set about to utilize their leisure time intelligently and creatively. The American business man is alert, eager and keen in his business, but stodgy and dull and droll in all else. He has neither nimbleness of intellect, grace of conversation, cultural sensitiveness, nor impartial judgments concerning vital political or social problems. He is quite second-rate. And it is true also of most American professional men. They have not used their hours away from their occupations

Most of us consume the precious years of our lives and all our physical and mental vitality in a desperate competition for the acquisition of those things which will bless neither ourselves nor our families. We do not preempt enough of strength and enthusiasm for those enterprises which, because they are pursued out of love and not out of duty and economic need, bring to our days the zest and color and romance of life and all the quest and eagerness of imperishable youth.

Religion in America is superficial because it must make the appeal to people who are in a hurry. But the Kingdom of God comes without haste! The heart of the religious mood is meditation, the hushed and silent contemplation of life's profoundness. But what American ever meditates?

We need more time to get acquainted with ourselves. We ~~should~~ ^{need} develop a new science: The Science of Leisure.

With the growth of our large cities, it becomes increasingly more important to provide adequate play-grounds and recreational for our children, and with the growth of our industrial civilization it becomes more and more imperative to train our youth in the usages of leisure for cultural self-development. And not only our youth, but our adult population as well.


Dear Rabbi Silver





Dear Rabbi Silver:

I send you herewith the perennial request from the Atlantic City Jewish Community Center for a lecture at their association on Sunday evening, January 8, 1939. They understand your fee is \$200.

I do hope that you will be able to accept their invitation. You will recall that they have been making this request for the last four years. I am enclosing herewith a memorandum covering this invitation.

Since this is the first invitation under the new JEWISH CENTER LECTURE AND CONCERT BUREAU, I believe it would be well for me to explain to you our reorganization plan. The Bureau has for many years been serving the constituent groups of the Jewish Welfare Board and lecturers and artists associated with it on a free service basis. Due to the increase in demands for service on the Bureau and a desire to perfect the type of service we are able to render, we have this year decided to experiment with a 10% service charge to lecturers. It is hoped that this charge will partially meet the expenses involved in negotiation, printing and publicity and yet not affect the forum costs as far as our constituent groups are concerned.

In the case of those individuals with whom we have been dealing directly, we would like to continue the contact on the same basis, despite the fact that we have added the 10% service charge. This change will in no way affect our educational approach to forums. We still look upon the forum as an excellent instrument for adult Jewish education in YMCAs and Jewish Community Centers. It is only in the hope of providing greater opportunities and areas for the Bureau to function in that this service charge has been added.


