

My dear Dr. Silver:

It was a great privilege for Mrs. Monosson and myself to be present in Washington at the Israel Bond 10th Anniversary Conference and hear your address - incidentally I requested, and received a copy. The three questions you explained so well were remarkable, not only to those present but to the public at large; it was a lecture straight from the heart, with facts, reasons, and benefits for our people, especially for the State of Israel. I believe you know I speak my mind, and I mean exactly what I say in this letter.

Starting from "scratch" I have succeeded in building this city up to approximately 800 families. This year Mrs. Monosson and I realized a dream and built our own little home there on six dunams of land. On May 5th, 1960 we held open house and it was a great honor for us to have the Prime Minister, Members of Parliament, members of the Army and Navy and other dignitaries attend - it was a day of great joy and will remain in our hearts and minds forever. Over 450 people were present that day at our little home. It was a pleasure for us to see the American and Israeli flags flying together in the State of Israel at our new home.

We expect to spend some time there each year - as we grow older, we will no doubt spend more and more time there.
