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

Dear Rabbi Silver:-

I am writing to you on behalf of the Bridgeport <u>Sunday</u> Evening Community Forum which meets every Sunday evening at the United Congregational Church, in this City. The Forum is a non-sectarian association which has extended to it the courtesies of the church auditorium, its choir and all necessary details which enter into making the programs effective and influential in the City.

From time to time we have had among our speakers friends of yours such as Dr. Stephen Wise, Maurice Harris and Dr. Krass and Louis K. Anspacher. 1 have an impression that you come to the East and I have been requested by Dr. Day, Minister of the Church and the real guiding genius behind this movement to invite you to address the Forum in March or April, having open at present the following dates. March 6th, March 13th and April 3rd.

Bridgeport is a short distance from New York City and can be made by train in one hour and twenty minutes, and the speakers usually leave after the Forum at 9:37 arriving in New York about eleven o'clock.

While our funds, of course, are limited, the Forum does express its willingness to pay some of its speakers for their time and expense.

Would you be good enough to wire to me, sending your message collect, advising whether you plan to be in the vicinity of New York on the dates indicated, or whether it would be possible for you to arrange to be with us at our Forum on any one of those three Sundays, Forum being from seven until nine, with a short question period after it. If it is possible for you to be with us, will you also be good enough to advise me what charge you would consider so that we can immediately take it up with our Committee and make the necessary arrangements.



Dear Dr. Silver:

I am writing to you as President of the Bridgeport Zionist District because of a serious membership problem in our city. Our district at its height, had a total membership of over one thousand. During the last two years this membership has fallen rather alarmingly and we closed our books last year with a total of 596. Even more disturbing than the fallen membership, is the complete apathy of our local membership and more particularly the officers and former leaders of the movement here.

Accordingly, Mr. Jack Rothenburg, a member of the National Administrative Council and myself went to New York last August to discuss the situation with Dr. Marks. We explained to him that, with the usual type of meetings, whether social or educational, we can only bring out a hand full of members, which further discourages the few workers we still have. He agreed with us, that a top name speaker, of our own organization, who could give us a talk with real substance, could help us back to a firmer footing.

The purpose of my letter is to ask whether it is at all possible for you to address one of our meetings some time in January, February, or March, provided, of course, that you intend to be in the east during these months. There is no question that your name, would bring out the members of our district, and we have been assured of the cooperation of the Community Council in publicizing your meeting throughout the rest of the Jewish community, as well.

Normally, of course, I would not address myself directly to you, nor even ask you to appear at the usual district meeting. However, I feel the situation here is very serious and unless a person of your calibre can be pursuaded to appear and give the needed impetus to the district and its leaders, which a large attendance and (without intending any flattery) a good, authoritative, meaningful speech would do, I am very pessimistic about the future of the district.

As president of the local Jewish National Fund Council, I was asked to write to you, and I am happy to do this. Nothing would make me happier than to have you accept this invitation. I must confess somehow, whenever important Zionist issues came up, I always lined up with you, so you see I consider myself a devoted GIOA of yours as far as Zionism is concerned.

One of the most outstanding memories in my mind is an incident that took place a number of years ago at a Zionist convention in Atlantic City when some delegates challenged you and your delegation to represent Cleveland Zionists, because you organized a Cleveland Zionist Organization independent of the local Zionist District. Ezra Shapiro and others challenged your legality.

This question caused quite an uproar at the Convention, delegates were divided into pro and con. I remember this question also came up at a caucus meeting of the Conn. region and I had a fight on my hands to line them up in your favor. This question finally came up before the Convention with Morris Rothenberg and in the chair, and by an overwhelming vote the delegates voted that you and your delegation be seated as accredited delegates.

Many, many times during my thirty-four years with the Z.O.A. important issues have come up and somehow I always found myself in your tent. Not long ago when the so-called progressive Zionists started their revolt, I was with you and Dr. Emanuel Neuman at that special conference at the Astor Hotel Conference.

In fact. Dr. Neuman remembers me well, going back to the olden days when he was the Executive Secretary of the Keren Hayesod and I served then as Secretary for the Keren Hayesod in Bridgeport.

My dear Dr. Silver, the reason I make this long introduction is because I don't want you to consider me one of the cranks who make many requests of you. I fully understand your high position and dignity, and that your time is very valuable, and yet in spite of all that, I dare make this request of you, because my love for Zion, Bridgeport Jewry and Zionists are determined to make this Jubilee celebration the most outstanding event in our city, and with your presence we can do it very successfully. Will you help us?

Bridgeport Jewry never had the pleasure of greeting you, and although we have had the privilege of welcoming many of the outstanding Zionist leaders in our movement. May Bridgeport Jewry have the great privilege of greeting its outstanding leader who did so much for the Independence of the State of Israel?

We have in mind that the celebration should take place sometime during the last days of April or the first days of May. Of course, we would gladly adjust the date to suit your own convenience in every respect.

May I, therefore, hope that 137R ANDN KINN and receive a favorable reply from you. Thank you very kindly for whatever consideration you may give me.
