





Dear Dr. Silver:

I want to thank you personally and in behalf of the National Association of Purchasing Agents for your acceptance of our invitation to address us on the occasion of our annual banquet Thursday evening, May 17th, at the Statler Hotel.

For your information wish to state that our National Association consists of approximately forty local purchasing agents' associations located throughout the country from the Atlantic to the Pacific Coast and from Minnesota to Texas. All of these local associations are affiliated with the National Association giving a total membership in the National of approximately 4,000.

The members are all purchasing agents or assistant purchasing agents of all different classes of industrial concerns.

The functions of the local associations are to get the local purchasing agents together once a month for a dinner meeting at which time some speaker gives an address on some current topic or on some manufacturing problem which might be of interest to purchasing agents.

Opportunity is also given at these monthly meetings for the purchasing agents to become better acquainted with one another and to discuss the outlook for various basic commodities such as "Iron and Steel", "Lumber", "Fuel", "Cotton", "Paper", etc.

The function of the National Association is to weld together the efforts of the local associations so as to enable matters of National importance to be



handled. For instance, within the past four years, the National Association has been very active in getting catalog manufacturers to adopt a certain standard size catalog which we as purchasing agents believe would be most economical for all concerned.

We have also been active in such matters as the standardizing of coal contracts, standardizing of invoice forms, etc.

Besides this there is very often either some State or National Legislation to which we can lend our whole-hearted support. For instance, the Budget System of the U.S.Government was most enthusiastically supported by our membership.

The one big result of the purchasing agents' associations throughout the country has been the development of the individual men in that they become bigger and broader and more capable of handling their respectful tasks and secondly, it has caused the big industrial concerns to realize as they never have before, the importance of the Purchasing Agent in the organization.

All these developments have come within the past seven years. Previous to this time there was no such thing as a purchasing agent's magazine or any literature whatsoever in regard to "Purchasing" but today we have a very live magazine called "The Purchasing Agent" and there are upwards of ten or a dozen very good books on "Purchasing." Under separate cover I am sending you a copy of the last issue of "The Purchasing Agent."





INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION

The campaign for the Limitation of Armament which resulted in calling for the Washington Conference proved that when the public opinion of the world is aroused results are accomplished. However much we appreciate the results achieved by the Washington Conference, it must be recognized that this is a mere beginning. Much still remains to be done, in fact every accomplishment hinges upon the nations continuing in accord with each other.

This Congress will discuss International Co-operation.

In the Life and Work of the Churches.

It is the business of the Church at this time to more fully exert its influence in social, industrial and political questions, especially as they bear upon international goodwill.

From the Standpoint of the Churches and Religious Life.

During the last four years the Churches of the world have been assembling annually in Europe to consider their common faith and their common world task. There is no surer harbinger of international goodwill than the consciousness of unity that comes from these personal contacts. National differences fade away as our common allegiance to the King-lom of God becomes stronger.

In the Realm of Relief.

Mr. Otto Kahn recently said: "I am a Wall Street man, supposedly conservative. I think I am conservative in my underlying instincts The world has tried for years now a policy of timid cautiousness and fear which has left it in an awful mess. How would it be if the world tried a policy of audacious kindliness, mercy and faith? I say, 'Let us throw our purse, our hearts and our brains open all around, mentally, actually and morally, and what will happen? I think something very much better than has happened in the last three years."

In the Realm of World Friendship.

The power of friendliness cannot be overestimated. Herein we find the basis of all plans and agreements for international action. War will be inevitable until all nations become friendly one with another.

In the Realm of Agriculture.

"Competition for control of the means of subsistence brings war and the destruction of the tllings contended for, whereas co-operation in the conservation and use of the earth's natural resources is the foundation for world peace." (World Agriculture.)

In the Realm of Economics.

"The principle of unrestricted competition is doomed. It has already drenched the world with blood and it is to-day filling every country with envy, hatsed and strife. We must learn a new word—co-operation. The new world order will be built on co-operative effort. Co-operation is the life of trade and when business men adopt t as the only sound basis of commercial life, business will gain a vitality and prosperity hitherto unknown. Men are created to work together to help one another, to supplement one another's strengths; they multiply their power by linking their hands, and their minds and their hearts. In the new world order the competitive principle will be held in strict subordination to the principle of co-operation." (Charles E. Jefferson.)

In the Realm of Education.

"It is incumbent upon all to be informed about the problems and difficulties of other peoples, "he knowledge of which is almost a sine que non of international goodwill. One day, it is to be hoped, education will operate in its field so successfully that wars as a method of solving international disputes among nations may pass away forever." (Stephen P. Duggan.)

In the Realm of Labor.

"Economic problems are playing every day a more important rôle in the equilibrium of the worle, and certain acial questions cannot be completely solved by international legislation without an international agreement. . . We shall seek to extend by degrees the spher: of these international agreements on labor questions. Thus we shall hope to serve the cause of universal peace." (Mons. Sarrien.)

In World Politics.

"The hope of the fature is the development of that community life among nations that already exists among individuals in the state. The new world order will come only when the nations realize that they are all linked up together for weal or woe, and when nations organize their relationships on the same high principles that obtain among all good men." (Frederick Lynch.)
