

The Temple Board of Trustees at its meeting last Tuesday, voted to grant the use of The Temple for the opening meeting of the National Conference of Jewish Social Workers on Sunday evening, May 23rd. We shall be very happy to welcome you here and to make the necessary arrangements for your comfort. 
Dear Rabbi Silver:

You are no doubt aware that there is to be held in the City of Cleveland a National Lighting Equipment Exhibition, and the Joint Conventions of

Artistic Lighting Equipment Association
National Association Lighting Equipment Dealers
Associated Lighting Equipment Salesmen
Illuminating Glassware Guild
A.C.E. Division, Association Electregists International

These activities are held under the auspices of the Artistic Lighting Equipment Association, composed of manufacturers from all parts of the country.

There are about twelve Cleveland manufacturers that are members of the Association and several of them, including Mr. B. F. Klein, are members of your Congregation. They have suggested and urged that you be approached to give us a short address at our meeting on February 4th at 10:30 A.M., Assembly Hall, Hollenden Hotel.

The purpose of this letter is to extend to you an invitation to do so. There will be between six and seven thousand visitors in Cleveland during that week, and while I am a stranger in Cleveland I am anxious that our meeting be addressed by a prominent Cleveland man. I trust that you have no previous engagements that will interfere.

I believe that a thirty-minute talk dealing with the following problem, with which I am sure you are familiar, would be a most constructive thing for our people.

Decorate with Artistic Lighting Equipment

The Lighting Equipment Industry is filled with a great deal of individualism and has never been thoroughly organized to do a constructive cooperative industry job.

For the first time in the history of the industry the present Association -- ARTISTIC LIGHTING EQUIPMENT ASSOCIATION -- has set up the proper machinery for carrying on cooperative work and for the building of an organization representative of the business, and embracing all branches of the industry.

Because of the general tendency on the part of a large majority of individual manufacturers to go it alone, it has been difficult to accomplish the one first necessary step, namely, to build an organization that could speak with authority for the trade. A very large percentage want to put into the organization their dues with one hand and expect results delivered immediately.

The real keynote that we are trying to get over at this meeting is the necessity for the elimination of individual effort and the promotion of united effort, plus a real honest desire to work until the organization has built an association representing a majority of the trade and to stick with the proposition until definite results have been accomplished. In other words, work and stick to double the industry in four years -- the program that has been laid down covering a four-year period of activity.

The foundation already laid is sound, workable and within reach. The principal thing required now is the right mental attitude of the individual in the industry to voluntarily support the movement and to stay with the proposition until the job is done. In other words, work and stick to double the industry in four years.

I believe you would be rendering a real service to our members and to the City of Cleveland, which is a center of the fixture manufacturing trade - Cleveland ranking second in this industry.

I will appreciate it very much if you will have your Secretary notify me by phone if necessary of your acceptance so that I may include the announcement in our programs, which we are now preparing to go to press and which we desire to mail to all in the industry.




