Cur Mr. Crotty of the Los Angeles office wires that he is afraid he can not handle any dates for you on the basis of 20%; as a matter of fact he pays his agents 15 to 18% on everything they book and in nearly every case the committees insist on having wirdow cards and distribution printing, etc. in order to advertise their lecturers.
