My dear Rabbi Silver:

It is a great disappointment to me that I am going to be out of town over this week-end and unable to talk to you im person about the new organization of teachers that is hoping to hear you on November twelfth. May I tell you just a word about this organization?

We are trying to get the teachers, principals and supervisors of the different school systems of Gleveland together. This organization, that has just been formed, is called the Council of Childhood Education of Greater Cleveland. Its membership will be drawn from elementary school teachers and principals of the Cleveland Public Schools, East Cleveland. Cleveland Heights, Shaker Heights, Lakewood, the private schools and the nursery schools. The organization has only just come into being and has as yet no membership but there is every evidence of enthusiastic response to the program which will consist of two large meetings with speakers, and a series of round table study groups.

We are using the Hotel Statler Ballroom for the first meeting, either November twelfth or November twentyseventi. A great preference has been expressed for the twelfth. Will it be possible for you to speak to us at that time? We can pay seventy-five dollars I am sure. I am, in fact, willing to guarantee that on my own responsibility. There will not be a person in this new organization who does not recognize your leader ship in the spiritual and moral life of Greater Cleveland.

I have no exact subject to suggest but these two ideas are rather close to my heart and might appeal to you as material for a speech.

L The problem of personality enrichment for the teacher herself. On the whole, teachers have too many timidities, are too limited in their range of interests to be the well rounded personalities

they would like to be. Many demands are made upon the teacher for professional growth. It is important that she have the opportunity to grow personally in fulness of life as well.

2. Character education from the nursery school to adolescence, and again the teacher's part in the whole plan of character growth.

Again these are not subjects, merely possible problems that every teacher is aware of and would be eager to hear your point of view.

This letter is to precede the approach of another member of the committee, Miss Catherine Ross, who will speak to you on Thursday when you return. Miss Hoss is principal of Rosedale School.

Hoping more than I can tell you that we may have the privilege of beginning this organization with your leadership, I am

My dear Rabbi Silver: Again we are turning to you as a member of our Board to help us in an opportunity of interpreting social work to a group we have never before reached in this way. The Boys' Work Committee of the Rotary Club of which I am a member, is offering to sponsor a course of six lectures on social work in connection with one on group leadership which they are repeating this year. These lectures will be from 7 to 8 P. M. and with the group course from 8 to 9 P. M. on the same evening. Can you open the course with a talk on "The Historical Basis of Social Work" on Monday, January 13th 7 to 8 P. M.? You may wish to state that subject differently. Miss McMahon who heard your address at the Pennsylvania State Conference tells us of the very favorable response and it may be that that lecture is appropriate for this occasion. Although the Rotarians are sponsoring the program and it will go out to all of their membership, the course will be open without registration fee to any man in Cleveland. We shall circularize all the board and committee members of the social agencies. Last year the group course had an average attendance of 200 men. A very important phase of ourwork is interpretation to the public and not many are equipped to do it before such a mixed group. For this reason we are especially anxious that you should open the course. We hope that we may have a favorable reply and we are being asked to get our program to the printer this week. 
