Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Cleveland, Ohio.

My dear Rabbi Silver:

Each year at the University of Colorado we have what we call "Religious Emphasis week". For the speaker on these occasions we like to have some outstanding religious leader. Last year Dr. Bruze Curry of Union Theological seminary was here and in 1933 Dr. Charles W.Gilkey.

Many times members of our committee have expressed the desire to have you come. One of our members was a parishioner - if I may use that term - of yours formerly, and he is particularly eager to have you visit us. So the committee has instructed me to ask you if it would be possible for you to spend two days with us some time between January 15th and March 15th. If it would be possible what honorarium would you expect?

The speakers usually make three general addresses and conduct several conferences with students who are more interested in the subject of religion. Of course all shades of religious belief are represented on the campus and religion has to be dealt with with that in mind, a thing you would naturally do, I am sure, judging from your book "Changing Religion in the Modern World". I haven't that book before me and hope that I am not confusing the title with that of Dr,Randall's book with a similar title.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

On behalf of the Religion in Life Week Board of the University of Colorado, I would like to invite you to be Keynote Speaker for our Religion in Life Week, February 22 through 26, 1959.

We are in the process of what we hope will be a significant change in our set-up. The University has taken over the week and the President has appointed a Religion in Life Week Board to form basic policy and to invite the speakers. This committee consists of four faculty members, three chaplains and three students.

In order for us to make our week more vital than in the past, we want to concentrate our presentations more around the contribution that each speaker can make to the week. We would try to build the week around you, inviting as many of our speakers as possible to fit in accordingly. Father Gustav Weigel of Woodstock has already accepted as one of our major speakers and we have also invited Dr. Howard Thurman of Boston. You would be the Keynote speaker, opening the week in an auditorium which seats 2500. This speech would also be broadcast locally and therefore would reach a very large audience. Doubtlessly you would be asked to speak for some Departmental Convocations and in some classrooms. We would set up seminars and panels in which you would participate with one or two others or in which you would be the only speaker.

We would appreciate it if you would fill out the enclosed sheets, listing specific topics we might suggest for classroom or departmental assignments. The majority of our faculty members will request only those speakers qualified in some area of their own discipline as well as in religion. We would also appreciate your sending us a complete biography.

We will be able to offer a small gift of one hundred dollars in addition to travelling and living expenses.

Under separate cover is a program from last year. This may be a help in seeing the scope of our program, although we are planning some changes in the set-up of the seminars.

We will look forward to hearing from you in the near future and hope you will be able to accept our invitation.
