My dear Rabbi Silver:

This letter is a "follow-up" to a telephone conversation I had with your wife while you were in Israel. Although it delayed somewhat our plans, we were so anxious that you should be with us that we deferred our plans until your return and are submitting by letter what we told Mrs. Silver.

The first building on our campus was the chapel, located on what we affectionately call our "Old Horseshoe." This chapel is over one hundred and fifty years old. Recently, at considerable expense and with infinite affection, it has been completely restored and is today the most hallowed building on our campus. It is our purpose to dedicate it exclusively to interdenominational religious services. To symbolize this dedication, we are endeavoring to arrange separate Catholic, Protestant and Jewish dedication services. We are seeking the acknowledged authentic voices of these faiths as the spokesmen of their respective faiths on these programs.

While I am a Christian, I, in common with Americans generally, recognize in you the towering symbol and the strong voice of Judaism in America. It is accepted that you do, for your denomination, represent most authentically its ideals, its hope, and its aspirations. For that reason, we most specially invite you to undertake the Jewish services in connection with this dedication. While we would like a date in early May, we would accommodate ourselves to your own calendar. Of course, we would like the services to be during a school year.

So far as we can ascertain, you have never spoken in this general area. Your faith has many members in this section; the members of that faith occupy positions of honor and respect among us. I know that all the members of your faith in the Carolinas would share with us the pleasure in having so compelling a personality as you to represent them and the larger body of which they are a part on such an occasion as that we have outlined. In short, your visit would be not only a climax in the life of the University but would be also a matter of deepest pride to your many co-religionists in this entire Southeast area.

Of course, this chapel--as all chapels built so long ago--is not large; but, if you can come, we will arrange another area for the overflow crowd that we know would be present.

I know your calendar is crowded, but we earnestly hope that you will accept. As I have indicated, we would regard your visit as a real climax in our college life.
