Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am conducting bi-weekly services at Danville, Illinois. The prominent members of the Temple there have been accustomed to invite prominent Jewish speakers for public lectures. They have had such men as Rabbi Hirsch and Stephen Weiss. This year they are anxious to have you deliver a public address in Danville. I am writing to you to ask whether it will be feasible.

Danville (Illinois) is three hours' ride from Chicago and about the same distance from Indianapolis. Practically any evening except Saturday evenings would be suitable for your visit. I am sure that they will be able to meet your terms.

As I have been asked to broach this subject to you, will you please let me know what are the prospects of your accepting this invitation. I trust you will consider this favorably and let me hear from you that we may complete arrangements.

I'm glad to report all's well here. We hold the annual College banquet tomorrow evening.

Mr. Fennberg forwarded your letter and we note the remuneration of \$100 - expenses which is satisfactory.

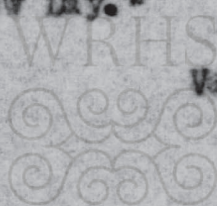
