Dear Rabbi Silver:

Dr. Shaw, the President of Denison University, my Alma Mater, is planning a religious forum to be conducted by a Jewish Rabbi, a Catholic priest, and a Protestant minister, on Wednesday, the 7th of February. He has asked me to inquire whether or not you would be available for such a service.

My dear Rabbi:

In discussing our Chapel program for the next semester with our Student Advisory Committee I was happy to find them enthusiastic in the hope that you would be free to accept an invitation to speak.

We hold a Chapel service for convocation each Monday morning at eleven, the main feature of which is an address of twenty or twenty-five minutes by an outstanding visiting speaker. Approximately twelve hundred students from many states comprise the audience.
