You may recall that on August 3rd, 1928, I wired you in the hope that you would find it possible to visit Denver the latter part of August, but you found it impossible for you to come at that time.

You cannot realize what such a visit could possibly mean, and if you can arrange to stop in Denver and favor us with the inspiration of an address on Jewish Education, such as only you can give. I will be happy, indeed, to arrange such
