My dear Mr. Peisers First let me congratulate you upon the success of your Campaign. To have come so close to the quota is a great achievement and you ought to feel highly gratified. In the second place, I should like to thank you for your letter of May 18 in which you enclosed a copy of a letter which you addressed to ar. Shroder relative to the disgraceful squabble between the J.D.C. and the U.P.A. It is an admirable letter and I endorse every sentence of it. Some months ago I induced the local Jewish Welfare Federation to send telegrams to the J.D.C. and the U.P.A. expressing strong opposition to the launching of separate campaigns. It was too late to effect any change. But the thing must not be allowed to recur this coming year. The center of conflict and personal entagonism is, of course New York and New York must not be allowed to dictate to the United States. If necessary, the Jewish communities cught to refuse to launch any campaigns next year unless the national organizations agree on united action. 



As the main feature of that evening's program, we are planning to have an outside speaker who will serve as an inspiration to the five hundred members of the Alumni Association as well as

to those others who will join us in celebrating our anniversary. We would appreciate your favoring us as speaker for the evening.

Perhaps it would be well to explain what the Alumni Association is. It consists of a group of young men and women who have graduated from the United Hebrew Schools since its inception in 1923. 
