The message of the Jewish speaker will have to do with the spirit within us essential to victory.

As further details are worked out we will keep you informed. Please send us a brief biographical sketch and a photograph for publicity purposes.

GRAHAM My dear Dr. Silver: University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, N. C. With reference to the meetings at Fort Bragg, near Fayetteville, North Carolina, to be held on October Southern Region Director tenth, eleventh and twelfth, will you plan your schedule A. W. GOTTSCHALL so as to be present around noon or as soon thereafter as possible on Tuesday, November tenth? You will be entertained at the Officers' Club at the Fort. Let me know as soon as possible the hour of your arrival and by what means of transportation you plan to come so that arrangements can be made to meet you in Fayettéville and take you to the Fort. Meetings are to be held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday night in different sections of the Fort so that there will not be much probability of speaking to the same people during these three nights. In our Camp Program so far the program has been worked out on the basis of the Town Hall of the Air idea with each man speaking not more than twelve minutes. After this there are questions and answers with the audience participating. It seems to me wise from previous experience that the Catholic leader speak at these evening meetings on the subject of "Victory with Security," the Jewish leader speak on "What Can a Soldier Believe?" and the Protestant leader on "The Coming of Brotherhood." There is no certain order in which the members of the team will appear. The underlying theme of the three addresses for Fort Bragg will be "Victory for Brotherhood - Our Common Stake in Victory." In addition to these evening meetings we will plan to have more intimate conferences with the Chaplains' Corps, at least two, during the three days of our stay. This will be in the nature of an intimate, personal, informal discussion period. As guests of the Officers' Corps we will be expected to speak at luncheons and dinners. We shall make it possible for you to go out on the field and speak to groups of the men, some groups small, some large, informally in gathering places and speak to these men for brief five to eight minute periods.

So, you see you will be kept quite busy. However, I am certain you would want it so in order to give you this opportunity to make the largest contribution to your and our interest in this job that can possibly be made.

I shall be at Fort Bragg during the entire period and so, with this work of explanation, will you ask me any questions if you need any additional information about the program.

Dear Dr. Silver:


