My Dear Rabbi:

I was delighted to talk to you and to learn that you are considering giving us the pleasure of your presence. The Commanding General of this post, General Cornelius E. Ryan, will extend the formal invitation. He is a devout Roman Catholic who has given maximum support to the work of all the Chaplains here.

He has extended an invitation to Cardinal Spellman and to Bishop Kennedy to represent their respective faiths.

As you probably know, Fort Dix is the training center for the metropolitan areas of the east which explains the very large percentage of Jewish Personnel. In addition, McGuire Air Force Base, a large installation, is adjacent to the post.

Knowing how busy you are, I can only justify this invitation by stressing the importance of this "Judaism Day". There are now three (3) Jewish Chaplains here ministering to the needs of the men. In their name, I want to urge you to accept the invitation of the Commanding General.

In setting the date, may I invite your attention to the only military holiday that occurs during the recommended period. Washington's Birthday falls on Tuesday, 22 February 1955, and would be the only weekday night unsuitable for this celebration.

The nearest cities are:





3,000 JEWISH GIS TO ATTEND TORAH CONVOCATION AT FORT DIX; DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER TO ADDRESS "JUDAISM DAY" FETE

FORT DIX, N.J. -- The largest Torah Convocation ever to be conducted for Jewish military personnel in the U.S. Armed Forces will be held at Fort Dix on March 1 when Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, world-renowned Jewish leader and rabbi of The Temple, Cleveland, addresses a "Judaism Day" assemblage of some 3,000 Jewish servicemen in Fort Dix sports arena. The program will begin at 8 P.M.

Chaplains Herman Dicker and Max Daina, Jewish chaplains at Fort Dix, have arranged the Convocation in cooperation with the National Jewish Welfare Board's (JWB) Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy. Col. Harry D. Henshel, New York, chairman of JWB's national Armed Services Committees, will bring greetings to the assemblage. Dr. Silver is a former member of the Commission through which JWB recruits, ecclesiastically endorses and serves all Jewish military chaplains. Dr. Silver's son, Rabbi Daniel Silver, recently completed a tour of duty as a Navy chaplain.

The Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy encourages the Jewish chaplains to organize Torah Convocations as occasions for providing instruction in Judaism.

Materials and guides for use in setting up Torah Convocations are provided by the Commission, which is composed of representatives of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, Rabbinical Assembly of America and Rabbinical Council of America. JWB is the government-authorized agency for meeting the religious and welfare needs of Jewish military personnel and of Jewish veterans in Veterans Administration hospitals, and the national association of Jewish Community Centers and YM-YWHAs.

The keynote of the Fort Dix Convocation will be the "history, traditions and meaning of Judaism and how they apply during these troubled times." The American Jewish Tercentenary will be emphasized in the program. A giant 30 ft. by 80 ft. backdrop is being built by Jewish servicemen stationed at Fort Dix to dramatize the theme of the Convocation.

Similar cultural rallies, though on a smaller scale, are regularly sponsored by Jewish chaplains at military installations throughout the world, with the complete support of the military authorities. "Judaism Day" at Fort Dix is one of three days honoring the major faiths on the post. A Catholic celebration was held last December and the Protestants will hold one next fall. The observances are planned under a program of religious emphasis instituted by Maj. Gen. C.E. Ryan, commanding Fort Dix.
