Dear Dr. Silver:

In behalf of the program committee of North Shore Congregation Israel Forum, may I invite you to be one of our Forum speakers for the 1951-1952 season.

The North Shore Forum, as you may have heard, is one of the leading lecture platforms in the Midwest. During the five years of its existence, some of the outstanding personalities of our day have appeared under its auspices, including Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, Vice President Barkley, Dr. Ralph Bunche, and David Lilienthal. Since the series is limited to five lectures each season, it is possible to invite only figures of great distinction.

We should be greatly honored if you would consent to appear on Wednesday, February 6, 1952, at 8:15 p.m.

I do not know whether you have ever spoken on the North Shore, but I do know that there are a great many people here who appreciate the opportunity of hearing you. Will you be good enough to arrange for a large, comfortable room for Dr. Silver? It is, of course, impossible for me to advise you at this time as to the hour of Dr. Silver's arrival, but in all probability it will be well in advance of 6 P.M. As regards the suggested subjects, the order of their listing in no way reflects any preference. "The Crisis of Our Age" deals with the need for a spiritual revival in our day; "Religion in a Changing World" concerns itself with the dynamics of religion; "The Future of the American Jewish Community" deals with Judaism in America in relation to Israel, in relation to secular education, in relation to the three divisions of Orthodoxy, Conservatism and Reform. The fourth topic, "American Leadership in the World Today", is, I believe, self-explanatory and would, of course, be more appropriate for an audience of Jews and non-Jews. Dr. Silver has left for South Africa and will not return until early in September. I, too, will be away from the city from June 27th until July 25th.
