My dear Rabbi Silver:

Last Spring I wrote to you concerning a possible visit by you to Greensboro and an address to our community. You asked me to take up the matter with you in the Fall.

The community as a whole has been conducting an open forum which this year is having difficulty in maintaining itself. In order to put the forum on its feet a group of prominent Jews have offered to bring a distinguished Jewish speaker to Greensboro and present his address to the open forum. 
Ohr Forum, last year, was very successful in point of attendance and in fact, it was necessary to move to larger quarters than our Temple Building.
