Dear Dr. Silver:

I cannot tell you how grateful I am to you for accepting the invitation to come to the Illinois Hillel Foundation.

It so happens that on Tuesday, January 8, however, Indiana plays Illinois at basketball, and since Indiana was last year's champion and Illinois is an aspirant, the game will probably draw close to 10,000 students, or practically the whole student body. I wonder if you could possibly manage either Sunday night or Wednesday night? I should not be bickering over a date when you have been kind enough to consent to come, but I want this affair to be attended not only by the Jewish students, but by the University student body. Two years ago when we tried to get you for the All University Service, the Y.M.C.A. would have jammed the Auditorium for you, and I know that when I announce that you will be on the campus ~~that~~ we shall have one of the largest audiences that this campus has ever sponsored. Could you then stretch a point with us and give us another date?

I am just now planning a symposium on "How Can I Develop My Potentialities?" The head of our Art Department will take up the aesthetic sense and tell our students how one's aesthetic potentialities may be educated. The head of our Classics Department will discuss intellectual development and the education for cultural appreciation. I am just now trying to arrange for someone to speak on physical potentialities, particularly the mental problem of sex.

I wonder if you would be willing to close the series with a discussion of the development of religious potentialities. That is, if I may put it so, the education of the spiritual sense.

The whole symposium, you will see, should be a very valuable one for the student. I should be very grateful to you if you would consent to climax the series with such a subject.

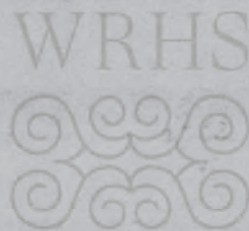

I hope it will be possible for you to come to us next year as one of our Open Forum speakers. You promised me when I was in Cleveland that you would try very hard to juggle your schedule so as to include us next year. We give you a free reign for any Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday in March, April, or May of 1932. If you were in Chicago during a week end, it would be easy for you to come down to Champaign which is only three hours by train from Chicago.

I need not tell you that you would have a very large and enthusiastic audience, very anxious to hear you. Our Forum this year included about 400 faculty people and about 400 students and townspeople. This is the only Forum on the campus of the University of Illinois and is a genuine contribution to the cultural life of our twin cities.

I am delighted that for next season we have already booked John Haynes Holmes, Francis Hackett, and Max Eastman, and we are just concluding negotiations with Everett Dean Martin.

We are in a position to pay only up to \$150.00. This is far less than the honorarium that you usually receive in public lectures, but I know that you will not allow that to be a detriment. It would assuredly be a great personal pleasure for me and Mrs. Sachar to welcome you to Champaign so that you would see at first hand the work of our own Hillel Foundation. I shall accept only an affirmative answer.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I know that you do not need to be reminded of your engagement with us on Wednesday, April 13th. We have been waiting eagerly for many years for your visit to our campus.

You will be speaking Wednesday night to about one thousand subscribers of our Open Forum. The audience will include about three hundred faculty people, several hundred townspeople, and the rest students at the University of Illinois. The audience is about half Jewish and half non-Jewish.

I do not know whether you have a previous commitment in another community and whether you will be coming to us from Chicago. If you do I would urge that you come not later than 3:20. 
