Hoping to hear from you immediately and looking forward to seeing you, I remain




My dear Mrs. Sparrow:

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

INDIANA UNIVERSITY

I am very happy to invite you to a Central States Assembly on "Foreign Economic Policy and Competitive Coexistence", to be held at the Bloomington campus of Indiana University on October 2 - 4, inclusive.

It is apparent that, within the last two or three years, "competitive coexistence" has become more than a political theory or slogan. Recent gains in the productivity of their economy have been used by Soviet leaders to challenge earlier American policies with respect to technical assistance and aid for economic development. In some areas of the Middle East and Asia, Soviet aid-and-trade offers have been larger than comparable United States programs, and in many other areas as well Soviet policies are successfully challenging American prestige and influence. Thus "competitive coexistence" has become a factual situation raising an important question for the future of American policy: if the United States expects to continue to exercise an effective political leadership in the free world, how can American economic policies be adjusted to buttress and reinforce, rather than to frustrate, the achievement of its over-all political objectives? This would seem to be the central subject for examination and discussion at the Assembly meeting.

The midwestern share in the growth of American exports and the prospective completion of the St. Lawrence Seaway project lend to the general interest of all American citizens in the cussess of American foreign policy a focus of particular and specific importance for members of the midwestern community. During the course of the conference participants will try to reach an agreement about appropriate American foreign economic policy which can be published as a set of conclusions of the Assembly.

Participants at the Assembly (a representative group from business, industry, agriculture, newspaper and civic groups) are being invited from Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio and Michigan. They will be guests of the University during their stay.

We hope you will find it possible to join us in our discussion of these vital topics.
