I am very sorry that this letter is so late in answer to your letter of January 8. The combination of school work, church activities, and flood troubles has kept me on the go continually. However, I know that you must know something about our organization before you accept the engagement, and, therefore, this letter will give you something of an idea about our plans and program.

The Wesley Foundation is a student organization for college men and women. Our purpose in existing is to make a "Home away from home" for college young people who see the need or are in need of religious guidance. Any Methodist or Methodist preference student may be a member of the Wesley Foundation, and is urged to take an active part in religious activities, such as gospel teams, vesper services, religious plays, and a study of the things that religion has to offer young men and women.

The State Wesley Foundation is really a council. Its members are the officers of the local organized foundations in the seven institutions of Ohio where Wesley Foundations are located. There are usually fifty or sixty members who compose the council, and they are the student leaders who will try to carry back to their local units the things that they feel the state meeting has given them. That is why I feel that you can do us a great deal of good. You can give us some ideas and plans that we may work toward in our local units. In addition to the students, the supervisors of student activities are also present. In other words, the students and the supervisors gather together, and by expressing their ideas, the two groups acquire some of the finer points of the other group's ideas.

I hope that this information has given you a clear enough picture, and it is my sincere hope that you will feel it important enough that you will accept. Of course, every man thinks that his own organization or group needs more attention than any other, but I feel that you can make our meeting in April very much worthwhile and very constructive.

I am writing in behalf of the Kent State University Religious Emphasis Week committee to ask if you will be our keynote speaker for a week of religious emphasis next January.

As director of the Wesley Foundation and minister at the University, I am acting as the co-ordinator for our religious emphasis this year. Our committee desires a speaker who will give us a message of real challenge, and also one who is nationally known as we expect to have an assembly which will draw more than 2000 students.

Specifically, we want you to come to Kent on Monday, January 25, 1954, to be our speaker for a week of religious emphasis which will center around the word, "SEARCH". We are planning four days of seminars, assemblies, house meetings, etc., with a team of leaders in such fields as education, marriage, prayer, and politics, to be set off by a campus-wide "mass meeting" or assembly which will stimulate interest in the week's program. Two years ago Dr. Ralph Sockman came to us for this purpose through the auspices of the University Christian Mission which was helping us with our first attempt of this kind. He spoke to about 2700 students, representing three-fourths of our student body. Because Religious Emphasis Week is such a new experience in the traditions of this campus, you can understand our concern to have a speaker who can give us the support and help we need at this crucial time.

Our second campus-wide program must be planned without the resources of the UCM, therefore we are financially limited. Dr. Sockman made his contribution through the Mission, free of charge to us. We do not expect you to do this, of course, but we do want you to know at once that this must be considered in our planning. We will be in a position to pay expenses and a moderate honorarium. We know that your schedule is extremely heavy, and do not want to ask for more of your time than you could give.

Rabbi Alan S. Green is to be here that week to represent the Jewish faith in seminars, evening meetings, etc. We would expect your main contribution to be the opening convocation. We will be glad to help plan transportation to and from Cleveland for you.


