



Dear Dr. Silver,

You will probably be surprised to hear from me after a silence of nearly four years since we last met in Africa.

Since that time I have finished my assignment in Johannesburg and returned to Jerusalem. Eighteen months ago I was invited to come to England to assume the post of Director of the Jewish National Fund for Great Britain and Ireland. My duties here will terminate at the end of the year, and I shall then return to Israel for good.

In these years that have passed, Aviva and I have thought often of you and Mrs.Silver and on many occasions have sat alone and played over to ourselves the records that were made of your speeches when you were with us in Africa during what was for us, and I hope for you too, a very delightful period.

We have always cherished the hope that we might meet again, and I know that from time to time there have been invitations extended to you to come here to England, which you have not felt yourself able to accept. We on our part would long ago have visited Cleveland, had the opportunity presented itself, but family responsibilities and other causes have prevented us from coming to the States. I trust, however, that as a result of this letter which I am writing at the request of Mr.Sigmund Gestetner, our President, we shall yet have an opportunity of meeting in the not too distant future.

Unlike the position in certain other countries, the J.N.F. in Great Britain is probably the largest organisation in this country. It has a strong Executive headed by Mr.Gestetner and a very powerful following in London and the Provinces. We hold annually at the Savoy Hotel in London a Conference which is usually attended by some 7-800 delegates. The Conference is not a fund-raising occasion. קרן קימת לישראו

It is a great national occasion and one of the two principal occasions of its kind in the communal calendar, (the other principal event in the "Zionist" year here is the opening Banquet of the Israel Appeal - the J.P.A. - whose guest of honour this February was Trygve Lie)

By tradition, the Conference opens on a Saturday night in the Autumn with a review of the past year in Israel and an address by a key note speaker. The J.N.F's guests of honour during the last three years have been Professor Lowdermilk, Mr.Goitin the former Minister to Washington and Pretoria, and General Yigal Yadin.

Zionist policy and fund raising are put aside for the evening and a vast opportunity remains for inspiring the entire community towards dedicating itself to Israel and to Jewish life in general.

Communal strife is comparatively unknown in this country, and to this opening session come the leaders of the entire community, the Ambassador, the Chief Rabbi, and the Sieffs and Marks have already accepted in their usual custom.

I mentioned earlier in my letter that there are two principal Zionist occasions in the calendar here - the J.N.F. Annual Conference and the J.P.A. Annual Banquet. These two evenings are largely complementary to each other.

Following upon the visit of Trygve Lie who dwelt in his address on events of the United Nations in those critical years when you, on behalf of Israel, were playing the principal part on the political scene there, it is the considered opinion of the leadership in this country, that a visit from you to Great Britain would be both logical and highly appropriate.

The opening date of our Conference is Saturday night, the 29th October, and it has been suggested that if the possibility really does exist of your coming across to England, I should come

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



Dear Dr. Silver:

Since writing my last letter to you, I received the very happy news, in the form of a cable from Mr. Edward Sieff that you had accepted their invitation. I am, of course, delighted to hear this.

There is apparently a problem in scheduling which he has brought to my attention, and, I am sure, to yours. I received the following message from him today:

"HILLEL SILVER PROMISED ADDRESS OUR GROSVENOR HOUSE BANQUET TWELFTH TWO PRINCIPAL TOWNS SUBSEQUENT TWO DAYS STOP AS MANCHESTER CANNOT POSSIBLY SECURE SATISFACTORY VENUE OTHER THAN ON SUNDAY TENTH MARCH AND AS BOAC FLIGHT FROM NEW YORK AVAILABLE FOR SATURDAY NIGHT EIGHT THIRTY YOUR TIME ARRIVING MANCHESTER SUNDAY AFTERNOON ONE TEN OUR TIME COULD YOU KINDLY PERSUADE SILVER CHANGE HIS VISIT TO COMMENCE WITH TENTH MARCH MANCHESTER MONDAY LEEDS AND TUESDAY MARCH TWELFTH CLIMAX GROSVENOR HOUSE DINNER KINDLY WIRE ME YOUR EARLIEST"

What this means, apparently, is that they are asking you to take the direct flight from New York to Manchester and begin there on Sunday, March 10, then at Leeds on Monday the 11th, and conclude with the principal dinner in London at the Grosvenor House on Tuesday, March 12th.

I do not know what your schedule is, or whether you can comply with this request. I am leaving tomorrow for Miami to work on our Inaugural meeting. May I suggest therefore that you cable your reply directly. The proper address would be: Edward Sieff, Joint Palestine Appeal, 77 Great RussellStreet, London, W. C. 1, England.

My dear Rabbi Silver.

My friends and I were most agreeably surprised to hear of the official invitation from the British Zionist leaders to you to head this year's J.P.A. campaign in this country. Our great pleasure at this news needs no explanation.

We true General Zionists of Great Britain have never ceased to regard you as the true leader of our people in the Diaspora. We have never doubted that yours was the only sound policy and that but for your powerful intervention there would have been no State of Israel today. The destructive policy of Chaim Weizmann to which he continued obdurately to adhere in total disregard of all the bitter lessons of reality (for reasons of which the less said the better for his memory) would have undoubtedly have led to total failure to achieve our national objective. Israel today would 'chalila' have been an Arab State and the Yishuv would have suffered the fate of German Jewry.

For years we have urged the local Zionist leaders to invite you to address an Annual Conference. Our demands were refused with monotonous regularity because you were officially considered taboo for British Zionists. Even to mention your name in official Zionist publications was strictly prohibited. Nothing was allowed to appear about your many activities or your publications. It would not be an exaggeration to say that in official Zionist circles in this country you were regarded as "enemy No. 1".

As you may know, we true General Zionists urgently requested the General Zionist party in Israel some years ago (long before the Liberal fusion) to arrange for you to address an inaugural meeting of true General Zionists in this country under our auspices, the date of such meeting to coincide with the annual conference of the Zionist Federation of Great Britain. We are convinced that your appearance would have heralded a revolution in British Zionism and resulted in the complete defeat of the Weizmannites.

We now desire to utilise the opportunity of your stay in London during March to address a public meeting organised by us, as well as to give us privately the benefit of your knowledge and experience.

Mr. Sharett who is now here for the J.P.A. has not hesitated to address Poale Zion meetings. In fact I believe his first public appearance in this country was at a Poale Zion Rally. Mizrachi and Mapam leaders who are invited to Britain to help the J.P.A. act similarly. Why should our leaders not do likewise? As we need sufficient time for proper organisation I would be most grateful for your speedy and favourable consent to our request.
