

Dear Rabbi Silver:

The California Conference of Social Work will meet at Yosemite Valley, Monday, May 21st to Friday, May 25th. While the Program Committee has been appointed, it has not as yet functioned except in a preliminary way. Some of the members of the committee have asked me to ascertain whether you would consider an invitation to come to the Conference to deliver one or more addresses. It is understood, of course, that the Conference would pay the expenses incident to your coming.

You have not been in California for a long time. In that time, the Jews of California have learned, I am sure, to appreciate men of talent and energy, and I am quite sure that in addition to having an opportunity to spend a few restful days in the Valley before it gets crowded there, you could also, if you had the time, serve one or more of the Jewish causes.

In writing to you, I am not unmindful of the fact that Shavuot is on Friday, the 25th of May, but I am hoping that confirmation and things that usually occur on Shavuot can be taken care of in Cleveland even while you are in California.

In any event, will you let me know what your reaction will be and if you can possibly arrange to say "yes", will you authorize me to say so in your name? I did not discuss this matter either with Rabbi Magnin of Los Angeles or Rabbi Newman of San Francisco, nor with any of the other rabbis here, but I feel quite sure that they will be very happy to have you come.







Dear Rabbi Silver:

I write you because of the great interest I know you have in Jewish education, and of your anxious desire to arouse Jewry to its responsibility to further Jewish education, particularly for the benefit of the American Jewish child and American Jewish youth.

I have read with admiration many of your addresses and writings concerning Jewish education, and I have no doubt that in some measure your powerful presentation of the issue has influenced and encouraged many to greater interest in the important work of furthering Jewish education in our community.

The situation in Los Angeles is perhaps worse than exists generally. Los Angeles is now a large metropolitan City but it is only since 1920 that it has assumed such proportions, and in the three or four years then next ensuing it grew so rapidly that it was then unable and still is unable to adjust itself to the rapid growth experienced, and for that matter is still experiencing.

Jewish education, and in fact, most worthy Jewish endeavous have suffered proportionately, and perhaps the rather discouraged condition of Jewish communal affairs heme, can be in a measure understood by reason of the unnatural and extraordinary development of the City in such a brief period of time.

All this is to have you better understand the task that is before us and to ask you out of the gooddess of your great heart to, if possible, lend us a hand in better establishing the movement of Jewish education in Los Angeles on a firm and sound basis. You can do so if it is somehow possible for you to arrange your time while you are in California during the month of February, to jeliwer the chief address at a banquet the Jewish Educational Association of Los Angeles contemplates arranging as the first of its kind, in the hope that it will arouse a greater interest and activity in supporting and propagating Jewish education in Los Angeles. If this first effort is successful, it is the intention to run one of these banquets yearly and make it one of the outstanding affairs of Jewish communal life of Les Angeles. Your presence and your willingness to address us on that eventful occasion will, I am sure, just about guarantee its success, not only this year but give us a way to start that will almost guarantee success in the future years.

I quite appreciate that your time must be pretty well occupied and that it is no easy matter for you to permit yourself to be importuned to address additional public meetings even to aid very worthy efforts like Jewish education in Los Angeles; but the need is so great here and the other pircumstances are such that you will be smable to rather conveniently favor us, and I do beg of you to make it an exception if need be and let us have the full benefit of your cooperation.

Incidentally, permit me to say that I was just recently elected President of the Association, and this banquet as a mere function is more or less my happy thought. We have been fighting hard to get some Gity wide interest in Jewish education here but our progress has been extremely discouraging up until about a year ago when Judge Elias V. Rosenkranz assumed the Presidency of the Association. Under the circumstances, he did remarkably well in promoting interest. I believe we have the ears of the folks in town perked up a bit. During the next year I hope to further advance our progress and with your aid I believe there will hardly be any doubt about it.

Many, many thanks for your kindness and consideration. I hope to receive from you word that you can be with us. If so, please designate the date that is most satisfactory to you so that arrangements can be put on foot without delay.





My dear Rabbi Silver

For a number of years we have considered the possibility of holding an International Recreation Congress. Two years ago we made the desision to hold one in Los Angeles, California, July 23 to 29, one week before the Olympics.

President Hoover is to be Honorary President of the Congress, and, confidentially, there is a possibility that he will speak there. The invitations to foreign governments have been sent out through the State Department and the Congress has been pretty well publicized in other countries. We shall start fairly soon to publicize it in the United States.

We have already had enough replies from foreign countries and enough interest from this country, particularly in the West, to indicate that it will be a very significant meeting.

The first general session of the Congress is to be a very large water pageant, staged in the Olympic Swimming Stadium, on Saturday night, July 23. On Sunday night we propose to have a music program in the Hollywcod Bowl with a chorus of about one thousand voices and with a massed band of about three or four hundred pieces, together with other musical numbers. On this night we want to have one principal address of an inspirational nature, given by a person capable of reaching an audience which may reach ten thousand or more, according to the estimates of the local committee. Aside from the general welcome address which we now plan to have on Saturday night, this will be the first outstandin; general address. All of our leaders agree that you are preeminently the person for making this address and we hope very much that it may be possible for you to do so. We realize that the distance is great and that it will take more time than usual, but we are hoping that at that time of the year you may feel the need of a trip to California.

We feel that this meeting may really be a significant one from the standpoint of international relationships and it will be a great asset not only to have your address on that night, but to have you present throughout the week.






