Dear Rabbi Silver:

In November 1944 the University of California, in cooperation with the University Religious Conference, presented an Institute entitled, "Religion and Contemporary Civilization." Some of the speakers at that conference were William Ernest Hocking, Ellsworth Faris, Arthur H. Compton, Alfred Noyes, and Ch'en Shou-Yi. It was agreed by faculty, students, and the general public alike that the institute met a need and was well worth while.

We are now arranging for a similar institute which will attempt to approach the problem of religion as it may aid or hinder the attainment of world peace, which we consider to be one of the most, if not the most important issue facing the world today. In order to put the institute on a high level we are extending to you, to Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, and to Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick an invitation to come and participate with us for four to five days.

The institute is planned for the week of April 21-25, 1947. Although the program has not been worked out in detail, we would anticipate that you would be scheduled for one evening as our main speaker, would make several shorter addresses, and would join the other speakers on one or two other occasions. We would expect to offer you an honorarium commensurate with your participation in such a program and would meet your travel expenses.

The University of California is particularly desirous of having the three faiths represented by men of your stature and we feel that the need for this institute is clear among the clergy, faculty, students, and the general public. Since your presence is of such importance to our institute, we should be grateful if you could find the time and would be willing to give of your wealth of understanding and wisdom to this conference. May we hear from you at your earliest convenience.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

Mr. Dykstra has sent on to us your letter of January 25th accepting his invitation to participate in an Institute on Religion and World Reconstruction at this University in April. We are very pleased to know that you are interested in this program and will be with us at that time.

Since the first letter was sent you it has been decided that the Institute will be confined to three days of that week first mentioned, namely April 22, 23, and 24. This means there will be time for you to fly to the coast and be here for the opening sessions on April 22nd.





This congregation (now in its eighth year) consists in approximately 375 families and is growing rapidly. Our excellent young rabbi is Julian F. Feingold, a graduate of H.U.C.-J.I.R. The religious school, which also increases in size substantially each year, now has an enrollment of more than 425 children. Our present facilities are woefully inadequate, both for our school and for our many additional functions. I believe I am justified in stating that in spirit and interest our congregants are somewhat above average, and with proper physical facilities our potential for service in this still rapidly expanding community is indeed great. With the impetus of your assistance I am certain that we can get off to a "flying start" in our project of procuring funds for these necessary facilities. The dinner is being planned for some time during or near the last two weeks in January, and I should appreciate your advising me of the dates you may have available during that approximate period. We realize the many demands upon your time, and of course we shall be happy to make such financial arrangements as you may require.


