

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I know how seldom you take time away from your congregation in Cleveland. If, however, you do manage ten days to two weeks vacation in the winter time, would you be interested some year in speaking for our forums in Florida? There is practically nothing in the tour from a financial standpoint but a great many of our speakers like to run down there as a sort of mid-winter vacation with income from the lectures being sufficient to cover all expenses and leave a modest profit.

We are just beginning to plan their program for next season. Each speaker goes down for ten days, from a Sunday through ^{a week} the following Wednesday, and speaks anywhere from six to ten times, not over ten, in forums, colleges, Rotary Clubs, etc. The total compensation is a flat \$300 from which the Bureau takes not a 25% commission but \$50, or about 16%.

If you could consider a vacation lecture trip of this kind between next January 1st and mid-March, the Florida Forums are interested in you and rather incline toward a subject you spoke on at Ford Hall, I believe, "The Radicalism of Jews".

I shall be very glad to know how you feel about this. May I ask, too, whether there might be any Sunday morning next season available for the Boston Community Church. They, too, are eager to present you.


Every year since 1939, when the Greater Miami Jewish Federation was organized, the local Jewish community has requested your presence in connection with its annual campaign. Unfortunately, the campaign dates of previous campaigns have always conflicted with commitments previously made by you and for these reasons it has been impossible for you to take part in our past annual campaigns.

This year, due to the local War Chest campaign, the dates for the Federation drive has been set for March 21--31, 1943.

Out of our local drive, the United Jewish Appeal will receive \$50,000 and our total campaign goal will be approximately \$130,000. For reasons that you understand, campaign methods and techniques will have to be intensified this year and new ideas developed to raise the goal set. More than ever before, we need the inspiration, the re-kindling of faith and courage, and the impetus that you and you alone can give.

I have responded to appeals which you have made to me personally to aid the cause in which you are so vitally interested. On behalf of our local community I ask that you be gracious enough to assist us in raising our 1943 campaign goal. As you of course know, the bulk of our funds will be raised prior to our campaign dates in the latter part of February at meetings and dinners of initial gift prospects. It is at these affairs that we would like your attendance. I ask that you give this matter your serious consideration and let me hear from you at your earliest possible moment.

Dear Dr. Silver:

By the time you receive this letter I hope that you will have received a direct invitation from Mr. Abraham Goodman of Miami Beach to be the guest speaker at the principal big gift meeting to be held in Miami on Sunday, February 18th. It would be especially gratifying to us if you could find it possible to accept this invitation because of the United Jewish Appeal expectations from Miami for 1945 and because of situations in the Miami Jewish community which require the dynamic approach for the raising of larger funds which, I believe, can be realized only through having a leader of your stature at the most important fund-raising meeting. Miami, as you probably know, has a resident Jewish population of approximately 30,000 Jews. In its annual fund-raising campaigns of the last few years, the Miami Jewish community has been making steady progress but on the basis of its assumed prosperity it has not, by any means, ranked first in relation to its population and certainly not in its allotments to the United Jewish Appeal. In 1944, I understand that the total raised in the Welfare Fund campaign was \$240,000, in round numbers, in comparison with \$139,077 raised in 1943. Of this total the UJA, with extreme difficulty and after a significant protest as to the initial inadequate allotment, received \$100,000. For 1945 the UJA has asked for \$160,000 and just prior to the Government's ban on racing, we were included in the 1945 campaign for a minimum of \$140,000.

Our friends in Miami, including Stanley Myers, are devotedly interested in the United Jewish Appeal and the programs of its agencies but by virtue of the ban on racing and other circumstances in Miami, with which you are undoubtedly familiar, they are fearful this year that the campaign will suffer acutely through the psychology of many of the previous largest givers who have had one kind of interest or another in the racing and other recreational activities for tourists in the Miami community. It is a preliminary belief of some of our friends in Miami that as much as \$50,000 may be lost through reductions in big gifts from the few individuals concerned with the activities to which I have referred.

It is our belief and I think that our appraisal is correct, that these particular big givers, and many others, are men of immense wealth and while their earnings during the 1945 season may not be comparable with 1944 and other previous years, they can give even larger sums than in the past and not suffer in the least. But we believe it to be of the utmost importance that we meet the situation head-on and do our very best to insure the maximum sum being raised. I am saying that which I truly believe when I suggest that you are the one man in the country who can be most helpful in this direction.

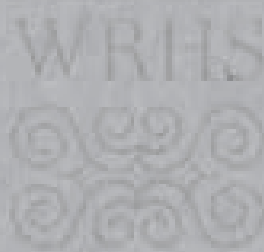


Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have just learned that you are coming to Miami next month to address the "big gifts dinner meeting" of the local Federation. May I say that I anticipate with pleasure the opportunity to see you again although I may not be able to hear you on that occasion since I cannot be among the "big givers" unless Uncle Sam decides to increase salaries radically in the very very near future.

Chaplain Saul Kraft of the Army Air Forces Redistribution Station #2 and I would very much like to arrange a joint Sabbath Eve service on Friday, February 16 with you as guest preacher. We know that our men, many of them returnees from the war theatres of the world, would be greatly honored and delighted if you can accept this invitation.

I know that the Federation Committee desires that you make no public appearance in this area before the Sunday night engagement. 
I thought you would be pleased to know that our Federation Campaign is over and that we reached a sum of \$359,000.00; you may recall that our goal was \$305,000.00

World Jewry Takes Active Stand Against Israeli Talks With Adenauer Government

By A Staffwriter

World Jewry, this week took an active stand against the Israeli Knesset's decision, opening the way to direct negotiations with the West German government in Bonn. Central Jewish organizations in such farflung countries as Brazil, Australia, Argentina and France voiced their strongest opposition.

According to a Jewish Telegraphic Agency dispatch from Buenos Aires, DAIA, representative body of Argentine Jewry, which constitutes the biggest part of World Jewry outside the United States, voted for the second time to oppose direct dealings with the Bonn Government.

Meanwhile, a resolution against the Knesset decision was unanimously adopted by the Central Committee of the Zionist Organization of France. The meeting was held in Paris, according to the Zionist Information Service.

In Israel, JTA reports, opposition members in the Knesset announced that they will appeal to the House Committee of the Parliament on the legality of the vote.

JTA further reports that the committee for Peace, sponsored by Mapam and the Communists, announced that it will continue to work against direct negotiations with Germany, despite the Knesset's Action. The group described the Parliament's vote as dangerous to the country's welfare.

'Better To Suffer . . .'

Meanwhile, Israel Rokach, Mayor of Tel Aviv and head of the General Zionist Party in the Knesset, in calling for opposition to the Bonn dealings, said "it was better to suffer than shake hands with the Nazis," the Zionist Information Service reported from the Israeli metropolis.

Rokach criticized the members of the Religious Bloc in the Israeli Parliament for accepting the

Government Coalition orders to vote for the negotiations, even though they were against the Government on this issue. Had it not been for the Arab votes and for a few Religious abstainers, conclud-

DR. SILVER CALLS ISRAEL DECISION AN 'IMMATURE ACT'

Miami Beach, (AJP)—The reactions of the Israel Government and its citizens to the German offer for reparations on Jewish claims was scored here this week by veteran Zionist leader Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver as a sign of immature statesmanship.

Rabbi Silver, speaking before a large audience at a Combined Jewish Appeal dinner here, contended that while making the grade as colonizers and fighters, Israelis had yet to prove themselves capable statesmen. Continued failure in this respect, according to Rabbi Silver, would portray Jews to the world as a people capable of making themselves at home only in the lands of others.

Later, in an interview Rabbi Silver amplified his remarks con-

cerning alleged lack of Israeli statesmanship.

Menahem Beigin, Herut leader, JTA reported, in the meantime called on the Israeli people to "democratically" oppose the decision. Speaking at a mass meeting, he stressed that he and his party were not prepared to organize an underground movement but will "mobilize public opinion on this issue in a democratic fashion."

Beigin appealed to all opposition parties to petition Parliament to hold a national referendum on the question.

U.S. DP Law Assailed As 'Racist In Concept And In Application'

New York, (JTA)—The present United States regular immigration law is "racist in concept and racist in application," Walter H. Bieringer, president of United Service for New Americans, declared this week in an address calling for efforts to re-codify and modernize the "quota" system. Bieringer spoke at the opening dinner of the two-day annual conference of USNA.

He pointed out that the "quota" system, which he called a "means of excluding immigrants from many countries," is keeping many Jewish

"I refer," Rabbi Silver said, "to last week's hasty experience in Knesset, the ringing of fire around Parliament, the swinging of clubs and the hurling of gas bombs as the British had previously done. Partnership in Israel is too strong; unity as an end therefore stands sacrificed."

Touching further on the reparations issue, Rabbi Silver said "the Government and the people are wrong. They act as if Bonn representatives stood on their doorstep with check in hand.

"In any case," Rabbi Silver concluded, "how can Ben-Gurion presume to force his will against such obvious opposition? It is ridiculous in an infant state."

Oranges To U.S.S.R.

London, (JTA)—The 2,300 ton Israeli Freighter Rimon arrived at the Black Sea port of Odessa with a cargo of 60,000 cases of oranges shipped from Haifa. It was reported here in a dispatch from Moscow. The dispatch added that this is the first shipment of an order of 150,000 cases of citrus fruit placed by the U.S.S.R. with Israeli dealers.

country, no large-scale full debate has been had before committing American Jewry to permit Jewish bodies to enter into direct negotiations with Germany."

Torczyner charged that "representatives of Jewish organizations in the United States have never had nor have they received a mandate from their constituency on the matter of direct negotiations with Germany.

"As a matter of fact," he continued, "I was profoundly shocked to learn that a women's organization whose membership counts in the hundreds of thousands and whose representatives have voted unanimously of in favor of direct negotiations with Germany, has not of this date in a single of its publications nor at membership meetings of its units throughout the nation, indicated to its mem-

bers that there was a question concerning direct negotiations with Germany.

"The mechanical ratification of this group's stand which will no doubt come later, as in the case of other organizations which have never democratically consulted their membership," said Torczyner, "is one of the saddest and deplorable facts of Jewish life.

At the conclusion of the interview, Torczyner added that "no one voice has the right to speak" for the Jews slaughtered by the Nazis. "All we can do," he said, "is listen again with our memories and our grief to their cries of yesterday . . . to the echo of their pain which still resounds the world over and which shouts for the dead and the living to hear 'Six Million Times No!'"
