It is needless for me to tell you of the strife in this city between the jewish people. We have three congregations and they are the worst of enemies.

Our club is the only nuetral grounds that they all meet at without a feeling of hate and I would deem it a favor and a pleasure to have you come here and talk to the men and women. Or still better to invite some of our better class of gentiles to hear you.

In regards to coming here it is impossible for us to pay you your full dues but feel that our board of directors would be willing to expend a small sum, and in the name of Israel you would be doing something that would help us all.

I for one would like to have you hear to speak to a mixed gathering of Jews and Gentiles as your presence would strenghthen the Jewish standing in this city.

In further reference to our club we only pay a small amount of dues each year and feel that we cannot pay you what you demand but that you will oblige us due to the worth your appearance will create.
