

My dear Rabbi Silver:

You have recently received an invitation from Mr. Felix M. Warburg to be his guest at the Beach Point Club at Mamaroneck, N.Y. on September twenty-fifth to twentyseventh. This meeting which will be informal, will be entirely private and without any publicity. I have been asked to plan the discussion program so that we may make the most of this unusual opportunity.

At a meeting in Cincinnati a few weeks ago of the Board of Directors of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare funds, we were impressed with the conflicting activities existing in Jewish life. We had evidence of the divided loyalties, the competition, the incessant urge to raise money, the lack of coordination between national and local activities concerned with identical purposes, and the newer approach to problems with which our communities are now concerned.

This gave rise to the thought that a group should come together impartially to discuss matters that cut across organization lines. We realize that even an intimate discussion of a limited group such as we plan will not solve our problems. We believe, however, that our thinking will become clearer and be better directed, our responsibilities more illuminated as a result of this meeting.

Mr. Warburg and others at once became enthusiastic when they saw a chance to promote a meeting to help integrate Jewish philanthropic activities with American citizenship responsibility.

Our subject for discussion seems to fall into three main categories:

A. Consideration of our Federation, Welfare Fund, and all other national and local Jewish activities in relation to our responsibilities as citizens in our communities. IRA M. YOUNKER 29 Broadway New York

- B. Our overseas responsibilities.
- C. The Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds:
 - In integrating Jewish activities;
 - (2) Its position-neutral yet serving as a meeting ground for all groups;
 - (3) Its function and responsibility to its members (the Federations and Welfare Finds);
 - (4) What its members expect of it.

Naturally Mr. Warburg could not invite nor could we bring together everyone whom we would like to have. A few only were invited, because it was felt that they would reflect the broad and wisest thinking of groups, and could take back to their communities and districts any consensus or direction that our discussions might indicate.

At a recent regional meeting of the Council the point was made that the numerous demands made on us by Jewish life may be creating a degree of separateness for Jewish groups not helpful to our general community relationship. Questions such as civic protective activities, general publicity, local and national involved in our appeals, will therefore be discussed.

I am sure I need not stress the significance of this gathering. As a limited group only are to participate, I hope we may have early acceptance from you so that the procedure of the meeting may be planned in dstail.

My dear Rabbi Silver :-

May I recall to you the conversation I had with you on the occasion of the reception to the Marchioness of Reading at the Hotel Astor, in regard to the building of the Beth Hachaluzoth in Jerusalem that the Women's League is planning to erect on the plot of land that Rachel Ben 2wi has so graciously redonated for the much-needed Center for girls in Jerusalem. As you know. this land is located in Rachvia, adjoining the home of your dear family.

I feel it would be fitting, that you be, if possible, our Guest Speaker on the occasion of our Tenth Anniverdary on April 19th at the Hotel Astor, which will launch the beginning of our Beth Hachaluzoth in Jerusalem.

We expect to have a Brondcast from Palestine at which Rachel Ben Zwi, Henrietta Szold and the High Commissioner will greet the members and guests of the Vomen's League assembled on this auspicious occasion.

I am sure that you know of the most valuable work the Women's League for Palestine is responsible for and are glad to tell you that the Batei Hachaluzoth have been classed as educational instituions by the British Government. This official recognition has enabled the Jewish Agency to procure special immigration certificates to bring into Palestine, young women from the ages of seventhen to twenty-three, to be sheltered and trained in our Centers in Haifa and Tel Aviv, and upon our guarantee to maintain them for one year after arrival.

We feel it so important to have the right kind of program that we are setting aside \$100.00 towards your expenses if you will consent to take the leading part on the subject, "The Future of the Jew Here and Abroad."

I know that this sum means nothing to you, but will you bear in mind that the work that I have been doing during the past twenty years has cost me many hundreds of times that sum for which I have, to this day, received no tangible return whatsoever. And, by the way, since every meeting that I have arranged monthly during the past three years by this method has proven highly successful, without exception, I believe its introduction in Zionist ranks will make for a rapid increase in the numerical strength of the movement.





A nondescript and disspirited American Jewry holds very little prospect of continuing to be a reservoir of moral and financial strength to stricken Jewry all over the world. I am sure that I do not have to amplify the argument and to burden you with a long letter. Under the circumstances, I hope and pray that you will accept.

My dear Rabbi Silver:

The faculty and graduating class of Highland Manor have voted to extend to you an invitation to be their Commencement Speaker at our graduating exercises on Tuesday evening, June 3rd at seven o'clock.

As you may probably know, Highland Manor is the only state-accredited, college-accredited boarding school for Jewish girls in the United States. Our pupils come from all parts of America and from various foreign countries. We have had a considerable number of Cleveland girls in our school, among whom at the moment I recall, Mrs. Daniel J.
