Meade Maryland June 11, 1942 C O P Y The following is a copy of a letter received by the National Conference We desire to have a Fourth of July celebration here at Fort Meade that will bring Americanism to the attention of the men in a vital and concrete form. Chaplain Reynolds has informed me that The National Conference of Christians and Jews is endeavoring to strengthen the unity of the American people by destroying religious prejudice and bigotry. I heartily approve this effort. We have a new outdoor amphitheater that will accommodate six or eight thousand men and is expandable beyond that. I would like to invite through your organization Mr. Alfred Smith, Mr. Wendell Willkie and Judge Joseph Proskauer to come to Fort Meade, appear on the same platform and speak to the soldiers. I know of no more valuable comtribution these men could make now for the benefit of their country. If these men cannot come on Saturday, July 4th, could it be arranged for them to come someday immediately before or after that date? Dear Rabbi Silver:

The vast concentration of American manpower in camps and naval bases offers an unprecedented opportunity to do a job of strengthening the sense of unity now, and building bridges of understanding that will be helpful during the period of demobilization when the men return to their villages, towns and cities all over the country.

As a result of conversations with responsible officials who have given their hearty personal approval to the program, the National Conference of Christians and Jews plans to make available distinguished Americans, singly and in teams of two or three, for visits to camps. Copy of one invitation is attached. We have a number of other requests for speakers. And there are 400 camps. The speakers will be presented in the theaters of the camps except where outdoor meetings are advisable. The themes will deal with the values for which we are fighting, and with some consideration of the post-war world Americans want to live in.

I am writing to ask if you will make at least one appearanse in a camp this summer at a time most convenient for you. It merits the sacrifice of an American leader, busy as I know you are, to do this for the men in uniform.

So that the program may be as speedily initiated as possible, may I have a favorable reply at an early date? If you assent, we can communicate later about the camp and the date.



Why Jewish Education?

BECAUSE every Jewish child should know and respect the faith, the traditions, the history, the culture and the ideals of his people.

BECAUSE Jewish education will strengthen the bonds of respect and understanding between Jewish children and Jewish parents.

What Is the Jewish Education Committee?

THE JEWISH EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF NEW YORK is the central New York agency for the advancement of Jewish education.

The COMMITTEE, which came into existence in 1939 under the stimulus of a gift from the estate of the late Colonel Michael Friedsam, represents a merger of previously existing central agencies.

The membership of the COMMITTEE consists of persons from every group in the New York Jewish community—Orthodox, Conservative, Reform, Labor and those unaffiliated with any of these groups.

The COMMITTEE aims to assist all groups to improve and extend their Jewish educational work without interfering in any way with their particular beliefs and principles.

WHAT IS THE COMMITTEE DOING?

THE JEWISH EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF NEW YORK enables the schools of every group in our community to improve their educational work by

- HELPING them through the services of expert educational consultants and guides;
- HELPING them to conduct demonstration schools for experimental purposes;
- HELPING them to prepare and publish curricula, text books, and other educational material.
- HELPING them to make Music, Arts and Crafts, Drama and the Dance a part of their educational programs.
- THE COMMITTEE subsidizes many of the schools to enable them to admit larger numbers of poor children who are unable to pay tuition fees.
- THE COMMITTEE conducts annual campaigns among Jewish parents to impress them with the importance of providing their children with Jewish education.
- THE COMMITTEE supports he Florence Marshall Hebrew High School which has twenty branches in different parts of the City, providing secondary Jewish education to graduates of elementary Hebrew Schools.
- THE COMMITTEE supports the Jewish Culture Council which conducts Jewish cultural work in forty public High Schools of New York and cooperates with the Board of Education in connection with the teaching of the Hebrew Language and Literature in the public High Schools.
- THE COMMITTEE acts as the central agency for the introduction of air raid precautions in the Jewish schools and for the sale of War Bonds and Stamps.
- FOR the teachers of Hebrew schools the COMMITTEE cooperates with the Board of License which grants certificates to qualified teachers.
- THE COMMITTEE helps to maintain a system of group insurance for teachers of Jewish schools and has initiated a system of relief pensions for teachers.
- THE COMMITTEE publishes children's magazines, textbooks and other publications.

There are many other activities in which the COMMITTEE is engaged, all of them aiming

- · To improve the educational work of the Jewish schools;
- To extend the opportunities for Jewish education to more and more of our children.

I was very sorry to have missed you at the United Palestine Appeal dinner meeting yesterday. I had hoped to have a chance to talk to you about your address at our public Hanukkah Dinner on Tuesday, December 15th, at the Hotel Astor, at which we expect about a thousand people.

You are scheduled as the principal speaker. In point of fact, you will be the only speaker with the exception of some greetings from Judge Rosenman, and a report of our work by Mr. Alan M. Stroock. We have set aside one half hour for your address, and I know what a swell job you can do in that time.

We are hoping that you will speak on the twofold theme -- the importance of Jewish education and the importance of a community agency to organize, improve and extend the work of the Jewish schools. You are of course thoroughly conversant with all aspects of this theme.

Some time ago, I sent you under separate cover some of our reports which outlined the large community program that we are attempting to implement. You may want to acquaint yourself with that material, even though you will not be expected to speak on any specific aspects of our work. Nor will it be for you to make the direct appeal for funds, although we shall be grateful if you will rouse your audience to the need of generously supporting a community agency like ours whose aim is to help the Jewish schools financially and pedagogically to improve and extend their work. What we are hoping for is that warm inspiration which we know is yours to give. You can be of great help to us, and we are all looking forward eagerly to hearing you on December 15th.

May I take the liberty of telephoning to you, long distance, on Wednesday morning at about eleven o'clock, in case you have any questions to ask regarding the character and content of your talk?







Dear Rabbi Silver: -

On the afternoon and evening of Sunday, January 2nd, the extreme suffering and tribulations of the Jewish children in Nazi-occupied countries of Europe, and the one haven of rescue possible for them, Palestine, will be depicted in a very dramatic and spectacular pageant, directed by Erwin, Piscator, at Manhattan Center, in New York.

This will be a repetition of the identical pageant shown at Madison Square Garden, last June, to the New York public, including 8,000 children. Several hundred children participate in the pageant.

All who attended the first "Rally" were unanimous in the opinion that it was a potent instrument in arousing the sentiment and sympathy of the public for the rescue of these persecuted children, and for the establishment of the Jewish Homeland in Palestine.

Since the underlying purpose of the "Rally" is purely propaganda and not for any practical work which we intend to do for and with the children, our executive board decided that whatever profits may be realized be turned over to Youth Aliyah, and to the Mizrachi Women's Organization of America for their youth rehabilitation work in Palestine.

We are most anxious that you be our speaker at the "Rally", for we know that your stirring mes-

My Dear Rabbi Silver :-

Last year, if you will recall, the Chairman of the Hadassah Long Island Chapters Donor Luncheon Committee, wrote you under date of Jan. 7th asking if you were free to come to New York on April 14th of that year to address our annual Donor Luncheon usually attended by some 1400-1500 women. You enswered very graciously within a week stating that MRS. WILLIAM M. POLLACK you were so committed in your work that you were not free to come - although as you said, it would afford you great pleasure.

> Today, as Chairman of this year's Donor Luncheon, to be held this coming April 25th at the Commodore Hotel, I am writing again with the same request, not unmindful of the enormous amount of work you in your many important posts you are confronted with this year, perhaps more than ever before. I am making this request of you because as one of the fortunate delegates to the historic American Jewish Conference (representing all of the Hadassah Chapters in the Borough of Queens) I was thrilled and inspired by no one more than by you, Dr. Silver. Since then have I given my every spare moment - and other moments not so spare - in spreading the gospel of Zionism and trying to combat the forces of Anti-Zionism wherever I have seen its selfish, undemocratic head crop up for I have realized, and you perhaps more than anyone of us that our people are in the midst of a life and death struggle and the next year or so will decide our fate. Much is to be done if we are to silence the traitorous voices even amongst our wan people.

> We Hadassah women are working untiringly to interest our lacradaisical men and women of the crisis we are approaching. There are many women who attend these luncheons, who are, so to speak, "social Zionists" not really understanding the implications or the values of Zionism. To them your message of Political Zionism at this crucial time, will mean much and will, we know, awaken them to the larger interest in Zionism and the political scope and hope of Zionism for Jews the world over.

As you, no doubt know, Long Island is the coming Jewish community, being inhabited today by young families who are truly in dire need of education along Zionist lines. Many of these young people are Zionists at heart but need the stimulation and the inspiration of leaders like you. At the Conference, that was so clear to all of us - the yearning in the majority of Jewish hearts for this Zionism, yet because of a lack of real leadership to point the way, to corral these forces, the loss of these potential Zionist voices. So you see, if ever we needed a strong and powerful Zionist message, it truly is this year, especially to the Long Island groups, I personally feel that if we could reach out to the people in the growing Long Island communities we could have a powerful voice there.

I know of no incentive as strong as your promise, Dr. Silver, to be our guest speaker, our teacher, if only for a short while, at our Donor Luncheon this coming April 25th, to give our women the political education, the hope and the courage that you alone know how to impert. I am earnestly hoping that this year we can have the long-awaited privilege of your being with us that afternoon.

I am looking forward with hope and anticipation of your acceptance so that I can pass the good news of your coming on to the many hundreds of our Hadassah women and their guests.


