Dear Dr. Silver:

I have just been handed your telegram of yesterday accepting the invitation of the Grand Lodge of the Masons of the State of New York through me to deliver the address at the Consecration Breakfast on Sunday Morning, March 20th. DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver has for more than three decades been the spiritual leader of The Temple in Cleveland, the largest liberal Jewish congregation in the United States.

He has been actively identified with many social movements of our day. He was an early champion of the rights of organized labor, and one of the first advocates in the United States of unemployment insurance. As Chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency for Israel, and Chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council, Dr. Silver is the foremost spokesman of Zionism in the United States. He represented the movement before the Assembly of the United Nations, and is one of the leaders who are responsible for the establishment of the state of Israel.

Dr. Silver is the author of several volumes on history and religion, notably his work on "Religion in a Changing World" and "The World Crisis and Jewish Survival".

John Gunther, in his book, "Inside U.S.A.", speaks of Dr. Silver as the first citizen of Cleveland.

Dr. Silver is a graduate of the Hebrew Union College, and was ordained in 1915.



The largest gathering ever to attend the annual communion-consecration breakfast of the Grand Lodge of Masons of New York State-3.160 persons-overtaxed the facilities of the main ballroom of the Astor Hotel yesterday morning to hear Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, rabbi of The Temple, Cleveland, and Lieut, Gov. Joe R. Hanley of New York join in condemning discrimination against minorities. The overflow group heard the speeches in another room over a loudspeaker.

The Masons had marched to the Astor with a fifty-piece Salvation Army band and a police motorcycle escort after Protestant memhers had taken communion at St. Bartholomew's Church. Street and Park Avenue, and Jews had attended a consecration service held simultaneously at the Central Synagogue, 652 Lexington Avenue.

They see in Judaism and Christianity the last unwearied watchman over the ramparts of human liberties who must be destroyed before their own freedom-annihilating materialistic revolutions can be firmly established. They must eradicate if they are to survive. The entire complex of ethical and spiritual ideas rooted in the principle of the sacredness of human personality, the worth of the individual, the transcendant moral law and method of human progress which are at the very heart of the Judeo-Christian civilization.

Thoughtful men are coming to understand that mankind's surest way to freedom is the way which leads forward to God. They have come to understand that faith in God is the strongest bulwark of a free society. Human freedom began when men became that over and above society and nature there is a God Who created them, who make the spirit into them, who fashioned them after his likeness, and that they are therefore possessed of intrinsic and independent significance, that they are endowed as individuals with a original and irrevocable rights and authority. Men became free when they acknowledged a higher authority than that of state, class, system or ruler.

Friends of democracy have somehow forgotten that religious origin of the whole democratic dogma in the modern world. They have forgotten that political freedom came to the Western world as a result of the long struggle for religious freedom, and not vice-versa. Every important social and economic movement in Western Europe in the last few centuries was inspired by the Judeo-Christian ethical idealism.

Modern democracy was born in the struggle for religious freedom in the 16th and 17th centuries. The demand for spiritual freedom emancipated from the shackles of tradition the ecclesiastical dictatorship and grounded in the authority of direct revelation soon expressed itself in demands for other forms of liberty. Political and economic rights were demanded by humble people who quoted the religious sanctions of the Bible as their authority. All men were equal because God made all men equal.

The things which they demanded were the things which the Bible, the revealed word of God, revealed to them and to all men,

The thinking of the founding fathers of the American Republic was greatly influenced by the religious ideas of many of the sects which sprang up in the wake of the Protestant Reformation. Some of these sects were hundreds of years ahead of their time. They held that the state had no right circumscribing the freedom of the individual. They held that the duty of the state was only to protect the good and to punish the evil, and beyond that, the state itself was evil. They demanded the absolute separation of church and state. They preached universal toleration and freedom of worship. They maintained that all property belonged to God. Some of them, like the early Christians, practiced voluntary communism which is a very different thing from the secular, involuntary, materialistic communism of our day; in fact, it is violent negation in everything but the name.

Thus, out of victories won for religious freedom on the battlefields of the spirit, there stemmed other victories for man's political, economic and social freedom. When the founding fathers wrote into the Declaration of Independence: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness," they were giving political expression to these seminal religious dectrins. When they proclaimed that resistance to tyrants is obedience to God, and when they engraved upon the Liberty Bell the Biblical proclamation, "And thou shalt proclaim freedom throughout the land unto all the inhabitants thereof", and when they placed on the first seal of the new-born Republic of the United States the figure of Moses leading the children of Israel out of Egypt, they were marshalling religious truth, authority and tradition to underwrite their political revolution. The American Revolution cindled its torch at the flame of a religious drama. The long protracted struggle in our country to emancipte the slaves likewise received its powerful momentum to see economic or the materialistic

conception of history, but from profound and dynamic religious conflicts which revolted against the enslavement of human beings to are the children of Cod."

And which heard in the tramp of men marching to battle the footsteps to God - "His
truth is marching on."

Democracy shrivels when its religious source dries up. An early and friendly critic of American democracy, De Tocqueville, cautioned # "Despotism may govern without faith, but liberty cannot."

There is a real danger that the whole continent of ideals which we associate with Judaism and Christianity may drop out of our world and be sunk like semember Atlantis - the analienable rights of man, the inviolability of the individual, the freedom of the human mind, the right of dissent, tolerance, brotherhood, equality, peace. In many parts of the world these ideals are already regarded as black heresy and treason. In other parts of the world they are still tolerated, but regarded as something of an armoyance and considerably in the way.

If our world is divided, so it is into two distinct and hostile camps, there is the danger that even the western democratic camp, in mobilizing its military for what it has been led to this is the irrepresible struggle will come to adopt the same technique of regimentation and suppression of all basic human freedoms which it is charged that those behind the so-called Iron Curtain have already adopted. Freedom will be sacrified in a crusade to preserve it.

The vision of the world united and made secure in the law in which the weak as well as the strong would be free to live their independent and unmolested lives is again fading out as it did after the first World War. In place of collective security and international cooperation, the old and dangerous device of power balancing and regional military pacts are being revived. Over all is the shadow of war draining the lives of men and nations, paralyzing their normal activities and distorting their outlooks and confounding their reason. The wealth of nations after the second

World War as after the first is being drained off into armaments and regional energies are being harnessed to war preparation. That all this in the last analysis on be done only at the cost of lowering standards of living, increased taxation, and the retardation of social improvements is seemingly not taken into consideration.

It is clear, therefore, that men of goodwill all over the world who are inspired by the great teachings of their religious, which in the case of Jews and Christians stem from one common source, the spiritual and ethical teachings of the Bible, should unite to defend their intrinsic spiritual ideale. We must work for the one world under all circumstances, and especially must we work for it with increased fervor in a period in human history such as ours when the prospect of the one world is dimmest. We must never accept the idea of an inevitable and irreparable conflict whether between classes, societies or nations, in spite of surface indications to the contrary. Athward the dark and obdurate irreconcilabilities of systems and ideologies, we must hold aloft steadfastly the witht of reconciliation. It is/to the best interest of mankind that we work for the hardening of the disastrons division of our world. It is/to the best interest of mankind that we become violent and indiscriminate protagonists of one economic system as against another. It is far more helpful to concern ourselve not with systems but with safeguarding those indispensable principles which each age must be challenged to safeguard regardless of the system which it prefers. Whether it be capitalism, socialism or communism, there are basic principles of human rights and essential human ideals at stake in each, and we must defend these ideals for which no system is adequate guarantee. Neither the rule of king, people or proletariat is sufficient insurance against abuse of power, the exploitation of man and the defeat of the spiritual promises of human life.

The long decate which will undoubtedly continue for generations on authority versus freedom, on social controls to insure economic security versus constitutional

guarantees to protect the individual, will not be settled quickly nor by the atomic bomb. Regional security pacts and armament races will not settle it. It is only through the very patient and heartbreakingly slow process of working together, through such available agencies as the organs of the United Nations, that peoples may find their way ultimately through the labyrinth of suspicion, fear and hatred to the open fields of cooperation and peace.

Herein lies the great opportunity for followers of the great classic religions of mankind to unite for a common service to fulfill ear common destiny.



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
