Dear Rabbi Silver:

During the week beginning July 3rd, the Seminary is convoking an Institute on the Future of Judaism. This Institute, which is being arranged at the request of the Rabbinical Assembly, will devote itself this year to the problem of the status of the Jews as a people.

The issue has, of course, been sharpened through the emergence of the State of Israel and the necessity of clarifying the relationship of Jews throughout the world to their respective communities as well as to Israel.

As you know, Professor Mordecai Kaplan has, like yourself, been giving considerable thought to this issue. He has drafted a paper which I am sending you separately and which you may use in any way you desire in preparing your own statement.

The Institute will be attended by members of the Rabbinical Assembly and others especially invited. We would like to have one seminar during the week arranged on the basis of the paper which we hope you will be willing to prepare.

The Seminary will, of course, be glad to reimburse you for your expenses in attending this Institute.



The arrest and detention without bail of some 47 noncitizens throughout the country during the past few weeks is a danger signal for all of us, particularly since the Department of Justice action was accompanied by midnight raids and indignities unheard of since the Palmer Raids of 1920. These outrageous arrests of non-citizens who have been legal residents in this country for 25 to 45 years illustrates how the McCarran Law is already being used to destroy basic American rights and makes the Conference particularly timely.

We hope that your schedule will permit you to address the banquet and would greatly appreciate hearing from you.

We who have participated in this conference have, by such participation, affirmed the faith of Jeremiah and Ezekiel that only by Jewish education and Jewish living can we sustain our character as members of the Remnant; for the quality of the Remnant is spiritual and not physical, universal and not local.

The Jews in the United States, even more than our forefathers in Babylon, are free to live as citizens and at the same time as members of the Remnant. We can be and are Americans and Jews at one and the same time.

Our faith in democracy, our devotion to the insights of our prophets, our will to live as Americans and as Jews, our belief that we, too, belong to the Remnant—this complex of thoughts, loyalties and faiths brought us together at a national conference on Jewish education; its success vindicates our faith, devotion, belief and will.

## Survival Rests on Jewish Education, Silver Declares at New York Dinner

The American Jewish community will not survive unless it is based directly upon a strong and vital structure of Jewish faith and Jewish education, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, outstanding Jewish leader and former president of the Zionist Emergency Council, declared at the Jewish Education Year Dinner sponsored by the New York Chapter of the American Association for Jewish Education on December 3, 1950.

More than 500 leaders in Jewish community affairs attended the dinner, held in honor of Judge Jonah J. Goldstein, honorary chairman of the Chapter. Speakers included Michael A. Stavitsky, president of the Association; Justice Henry Clay Greenberg, Chapter chairman; Judge Goldstein and Daniel G. Albert, toastmaster.

The American Jewish community will be centered in Judaism or it will not survive, Dr. Silver stated. "It will be as an ethnic-religious community that it will carry on on the American scene, or it will disintegrate in the course of time. Our concentration in the last generation upon philanthropy, foreign relief and civil defense has persuaded many Jews that these represent the totality of Judaism, and that they are the true means of our survival. This is a dangerous delusion. These activities are commendable and necessary, but Jewish life in America will wither unless it sends its roots deep down into the rich soil of Jewish faith and Jewish learn-

Pointing out that "the state is steadily moving in on all fields of social and welfare services," Dr. Silver declared that the importance of specifically Jewish agencies in these fields will progressively diminish. Likewise, he said, "campaigns for foreign relief will not continue indefinitely, and they cannot be counted upon to keep Jewish life permanently mobilized. Without a vital religion and a replenishing Jewish education and scholarship, the American Jewish community will linger on as a waning and decaying residuum of the past until some unforeseen storm breaks over it and shatters it beyond repair."

Mr. Stavitsky told the dinner guests that Jewish Education Year had been proclaimed by the American Association in order to encourage Jewish communities to review their achievements of the past half-century, and to plan progress by raising standards and deepening Jewish community responsibility for Jewish education in the United States. He reported that observances of Jewish Education Year had been held in major communities throughout the country during 1950, to culminate in the National Conference on Jewish Education.

Justice Greenberg presented a testimonial scroll to Judge Goldstein, in tribute to "his many years of outstanding leadership in Jewish affairs, both in New York City and throughout the nation, devoted to the great principle that Jewish education is a fitting and necessary complement to the American system of democratic public education."

Dr. Silver, in his address, declared: "The wise architects of the future of the American Jewish community will do well to strengthen the central and indispensable institution of the Jewish community, the synagogue, which is also the school. If the synagogue is to become the institution primarily responsible for the survival of the American Jewish community, then it must drastically reorient itself. It must shift its emphasis from a place of worship to a place of serious religious education, far more extensive and intensive than anything we have so far achieved. Our Sunday Schools are simply not preparing Jews for the kind of American Jewish community which we have in mind."

Pointing out that "no Jewish community ever survived for long which igpored Hebrew," Dr. Silver said that "failure to teach the Hebrew language in our schools is consigning the future of the American Jewish community to cultural sterility. If we are thinking of





#### JEWISH COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT COUNTRY CONTINUE TO REPORT INCREASED CONTRIBUTIONS

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- Jewish welfare fund campaigns throughout the United States and Canada are maintaining a strong "plus giving" pace to meet crucial needs in Israel, overseas and at home, according to reports received by the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds.

These reports, the Council said in a statement today, indicate that early increases over 1950, averaging up to and beyond 22 percent, are continuing in many communities as campaigns approach the half-way mark. "Plus" results are in evidence from the largest down to the smallest communities, the statement declared. It mentioned as "typical" the experience in Fhiladelphia, Cleveland, Detroit, Newark, Miami, Buffalo, Dallas and Cincinnati.

Samuel Daroff, general chairman of the Combined Campaign of the Philadelphia Allied Jewish Appeal and the Medical Center Building Fund, reported a resounding 42 percent increase over funds raised from the same people at the Leader's Dinner, March 29. At this function \$2,054,272 was raised in contrast to their 1950 gifts totalling \$1,446,670. Fhiladelphia's next public report will be made April 18.

Miami, which is further advanced than most community campaigns, is still maintaining a robust 21.4 percent increase over 1950. To date Miami has raised \$1,040,-257 as against \$856,923 from the same people in 1950. Cleveland has pushed its percentage of increase from 20 to 22 as the campaign has gathered momentum in that community. At a Special Gifts dinner April 3, \$1,310,695 was raised as against a 1950 total of \$1,073,000 from the same people. This by far is the highest total ever achieved by Cleveland at a fund-raising meeting.

In its first public report, Cincinnati announced a total of \$575,260 raised in 1951, contrasted to \$490,824 from the same people in 1950. This represents a 17 percent increase. Newark, which moved away to a fast campaign opening success, is continuing its "plus gift" status as it approaches the million-dollar mark. To date, \$952,000 has been raised, as against \$821,000 from the same people in 1950. This total represents a 16 percent advance over last year.

Detroit and Buffalo reported increases of 12 and 13 percent over 1950. The Motor City has now raised \$1,610,000 as against \$1,437,500 from the same people in 1950, and Buffalo has registered \$329,272 as against a 1950 sum of \$291,886 from the same contributors. Reporting an increase of 18 percent over 1950, the Dallas Jewish Welfare Federation Campaign has thus far raised \$664,587, compared to \$562,893 in 1950 from the same people. The campaign began with the largest Advance Gifts meeting in the history of the community.

#### ISRAEL MINISTER ADDRESSES U.J.A. LEADERS IN NEWARK; STRESSES NEED OF GIFT DOLLARS

NEWARK, April 9. (JTA) -- The importance of the United Jewish Appeal for Israel was emphasized today by Yaacov Geri, Israeli Minister for Trade and Industry, addressing several hundred U.J.A. campaign workers at the Essex House. Mr. Geri reported on up-to-the-minute economic conditions in Israel.

#### MILTON WEILL ELECTED PRESIDENT OF NEW YORK FEDERATION OF JEWISH PHILANTHROPIES

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- Milton Weill, veteran of philanthropic and civic activities, was today elected president of the Federation of Jewish Fhilanthropies of New York, at a meeting of the Federation's Board of Trustees. Mr. Weill, who became the Federation's 14th president, succeeds Ralph E. Samuel.

#### Z.O.A. PRESIDENT APPLAIS FOR QUICK PASSAGE BY CONGRESS OF GRANT-IN-AID BILL FOR ISRAEL

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- An appeal for quick passage by Congress of the joint bill, introduced under bi-partisan sponsorship, for a grant-in-aid of \$150,000,-000 to the state of Israel was voiced here last night by Benjamin G. Browdy, president of the Zionist Organization of America, addressing a meeting of the national executive committee of the Z.O.A. at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel. The meeting was attended by about 100 members from all parts of the country.

Mr. Browdy also stressed the urgent need of aiding the United Jewish Appeal and supporting the Israeli bond issue of \$500,000,000 which will be offered in the United States on May 1st. The meeting was also addressed by Rabbi Abba Silver and by the two General Zionist Israeli leaders, Joseph Serlin and Major Shalom Zysman, now on a visit to this country.

#### J.N.F. IN AMERICA RECEIVED ABOUT \$250,000 FROM WILLS AND BEQUESTS LAST YEAR

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- Close to a quarter of a million dollars from wills and bequests was received last year by the Jewish National Fund, it was announced here by Mendel N. Fisher, executive director. Speaking at a meeting called to discuss the J.N.F.'s recently established Dapartment of Living Legacies, Mr. Fisher said also that \$200,000 in insurance policies, naming the Jewish National Fund as a beneficiary, has already been received.

Under the Living Legacies plan the J.N.F. guarantees a fixed income for life to American Jews who assign their capital to the organization for use in the upbuilding of Israel. Mr. Fisher told the gathering that in Israel the Jewish National Fund has received the sum of \$2,800,000 under its Living Legacies program.

#### PIONEER WOMEN'S THREE-DAY CONFERENCE DISCUSSES AID TO CHILDREN IN ISRAEL

KANSAS CITY, Mo., April 9. (JTA) -- Problems of child rescue and rehabilitation work were discussed here this week-end at a tri-state regional conference of the Ploneer Women, Zionist Labor group. The conference marked World Jewish Child's Day yesterday.

More than 100 delegates from 12 states attended the three-day parley, which closed last night. They came from Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Nebraska, Georgia, Louisiana, Missouri, Tennessee, Colorada, Oklahoma and Texas. The Pioneer Women has established, and now maintains, a network of more than 250 child-care centers, youth villages, agricultural and vocational guidance schools and social service institutions throughout Israel.

#### JEWISH WAR VETERANS HONOR DR. SILVER; PRESENT HIM WITH ORGANIZATION'S MEDAL OF MERIT

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- The Jewish War Veterans of the United States yesterday presented its medal of merit to Dr. Abba Hillel Silver at a meeting held at the Concourse Plaza Hotel. The award was given to the Zionist leader for "distinguished leadership in mobilizing the moral and material resources of world Jewry in the struggle to establish and secure in the free state of Israel a new life and a new hope for oppressed and persecuted Jews."

#### 25,000 JEWS ATTEND MASS MEETING ADDRESSED BY GOLDA MYERSON IN BUENOS AIRES

BUENOS AIRES, April 9. (JTA) -- Twenty-five thousand Jews last night attended a mass meeting here sponsored by the United Jewish Campaign and which featured Israel's woman Labor Minister, Golda Myerson, as its chief speaker. Mrs. Myerson called on Argentine Jewry to become Israel's partner in its great task. Earlier, Mrs. Myerson conformed with Gen. Juan Pistarini, Argentine Minister of Public Works. She was the recipient of flowers from Mme. Eva Peron, First Lady of Argentina.

We earnestly hope that you can join in this meeting which we believe will make a real contribution to the clarification of a momentous issue.



Would you be good enough to advise me by collect wire whether you can be with us at Carnegie Hall on July 25. In the hope of an affirmative reply, will you let us know which aspect of the civil rights issue you prefer to discuss?

# We join Black's dissent

In Dennis et al v. U.S., No. 336

MR. JUSTICE BLACK, dissenting.

Here again, as in Breard v. Alexandria, decided this day, my basic disagreement with the Court is not as to how we should explain or reconcile what was said in prior decisions but springs from a fundamental difference in constitutional approach. Consequently, it would serve no useful purpose to state my position at length.

At the outset I want to emphasize what the crime involved in this case is, and what it is not. These petitioners were not charged with an attempt to overthrow the Government. They were not charged with non-verbal acts of any kind designed to overthrow the Government. They were not even charged with saying anything or writing anything designed to overthrow the Government. The charge was that they agreed to assemble and to talk and publish certain ideas at a later date: The indictment is that they conspired to organize the Communist Party and to use speech or newspapers and other publications in the future to teach and advocate the forcible overthrow of the Government. No matter how it is worded, this is a virulent form of prior censorship of speech and press, which I believe the First Amendment forbids. I would hold Section 3 of the Smith Act authorizing this prior restraint unconstitutional on its face and as applied.

But let us assume, contrary to all constitutional ideas of fair criminal procedure, that petitioners although not indicted for the crime of actual advocacy, may be punished for it. Even on this radical assumption, the only way to affirm these convictions, as the dissent of Mr. Justice Douglas shows, is to qualify drastically or wholly repudiate the established "clear and present danger" rule. This the Court does in a way which greatly restricts the protections afforded by the First Amendment. The opinions for affirmance show that the chief reason for jettisoning the rule is the expressed fear that advocacy of Communist doctrine endangers the safety of the Republic. Undoubtedly, a governmental policy of unfettered communication of ideas does entail dangers. To the Founders of this Nation, however, the benefits derived from free expression were worth the risk. They embodied this philosophy in the First Amendment's command that Congress "shall make no law abridging . . . the freedom of speech, or of the press. . . . " I have always believed that the First Amendment is the keystone of our Government, that the freedoms it guarantees provide the best insurance against destruction of all freedom. At least as to speech in the realm of public matters, I believe that the "clear and present danger" test does not "mark the furthermost constitutional boundaries of protected expression" but does "no more than recognize a minimum compulsion of the Bill of Rights." (Bridges v. California, 314 U.S. 252, 263.)

So long as this Court exercises the power of judicial review of legislation, I cannot agree that the First Amendment permits us to sustain laws suppressing freedom of speech and press on the basis of Congress' or our own notions of mere "reasonableness." Such a doctrine waters down the First Amendment so that it amounts to little more than an admonition to Congress. The Amendment as so construed is not likely to protect any but those "safe" or orthodox views which rarely need its protection. I must also express my objection to the holding because, as Mr. Justice Douglas' dissent shows, it sanctions the determination of a crucial issue of fact by the judge rather than by the jury. Nor can I let this opportunity pass without expressing my objection to the severely limited grant of certiorari in this case which precluded consideration here of at least two other reasons for reversing these convictions: (1) the record shows a discriminatory selection of the jury panel which prevented trial before a representative cross section of the community; (2) the record shows that one member of the trial jury was violently hostile to petitioners before and during the trial.

Public opinion being what it now is, few will protest the conviction of these Communist petitioners. There is hope, however, that in calmer times, when present pressures, passions and fears subside, this or some later Court will restore the First Amendment liberties to the high preferred place where they belong in a free society.

We lend our public support in behalf of a rehearing of the case before the Supreme Court.

This letter is in the nature of a confidential report to you and I should like to advise you that the delegates to the Brooklyn Region Convention are going to be asked to voice their disapproval of the resolution passed at the last National Convention in Atlantic City which bound us with the General Zionist Party in Israel. It is my estimation that many of the delegates do not understand the full import of that resolution and I should like to see Brooklyn well informed.

Naturally, I am coming to a point which you recognize, namely that if Dr. Abba Hillel Silver were to allow himself to be escorted while he is in New York on Sunday, September 16th, to the Brooklyn Region Convention, which is an hour and a half away from mid-town New York, and would agree to be the speaker at our Sunday luncheon, it would be of tremendous help to our convention, to have such a distinguished person as you with us and at the same time enable the delegates to hear from you on a subject which I consider so important.

I hope that you will be able to accept this invitation, and if I can hear from you at once indicating your acceptance, I need not add that it means that so many more delegates will attend our convention. It would help our publicity greatly.

I have the honor to invite you to speak at a Town Hall meeting in New York City on the evening of September 28th. Our theme is THE RIGHT TO ADVOCATE PEACE. Within this context we are particularly concerned with the action taken against one of America's eminent scholars, Dr. W. E. B. DuBois, Chairman of the former Peace Information Center.

During this period when international relations have become so strained, many responsible and reputable citizens have been subjected to injudicious and damaging attacks as "Un-American" or "subversive". Only recently the President vigorously critized this technique of slander and intimidation.

### A STATEMENT TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE

When Dr. W.E.B. DuBois and his associates of the former Peace Information Center were indicted upon the ground of failure to register under the Foreign Agents Registration Act, a profound question was posed to every man and woman of the arts, sciences and professions.

For more than sixty years, Dr. DuBois has devoted himself to the struggle for the equal rights of the Negro people and for racial and international understanding. As a leader of the Negro people and founder of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, he has contributed greatly to the struggle for equal rights for Negroes and thus for the realization of freedom for all Americans. As writer, anthropologist, historian, member of the National Institute of Arts and Letters, life member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, member of the London World Races Congress, in consultation with leaders at the founding of the League of Nations in 1919, and consultant at the United Nations in 1945, organizer of the Pan-African Congress in the Twenties, Special Minister from the United States to Liberia, and author of a dozen books on the Negro and colonial peoples, the work of W. E. B. DuBois has been a contribution of lasting value to American and world culture.

Our country is justly proud of Dr. DuBois as it is of other outstanding American scholars, writers, artists, musicians and scientists. In a larger sense, however, the creative work of American and foreign cultural figures is the property of all mankind. But all scientists, writers and other professional workers are gravely concerned with the trend, in these tragic days of international tension, to build a tariff wall against the free international movement of ideas. They know that free interchange of ideas is essential for extending the frontiers of human knowledge. They know that peace is the soil in which a flourishing culture grows. For this reason, cultural workers in all countries throughout history have been traditionally devoted to peace, some at great cost to themselves.

The indictment of Dr. DuBois and his associates is but one of numerous recent actions against individuals and organizations that advocate peaceful solutions to the world's crisis. In this time of hysteria, the attempted labeling of "foreign agent" on a distinguished scholar and leader of a peace movement can fairly be interpreted as an effort to intimidate and silence all advocates of peace.

If this indictment of Dr. DuBois and his associates is not defeated by an aroused public opinion, no person or organization, whose views on the crucial issue of war and peace differ from the administration in power, will be safe from calumny and attack. As writers, scientists, artists and professionals, we uphold the constitutional right of all citizens to speak for peace. We call upon the Federal authorities to withdraw the prosecution of Dr. DuBois and his colleagues.



WE, THE UNDERSIGNED members of various religious groups, are very disturbed at the continuance of a state of war with its dreadful cost in human lives and destruction of property. We feel deeply disappointed that the recent at-tempts to obtain at least a truce in Korea have proved in vain. Widespread war is the dreaded prospect for the future. We, who are in close daily contact with our people, are keenly aware of the fervent desires of their hearts and minds for peace.

Our philosophy of peace finds no clearer expression than in the words of Edmund Burke:

"The proposition is peace. Not peace through the medium of war; not peace to be bunted through the labyrinth of intricate and endless negotiations; not peace to depend on the juridical determination of perplexing questions, or the precise marking the shadowy boundaries of a complex government. It is simple peace; sought in its natural course and in its ordinary baunts. It is peace sought in the spirit of peace, and laid in principles purely pacific."

With firm faith in the will of the people, under God, to achieve a peaceful world, we call upon men and women of all persuasions, to meet with us in fellowship, to discuss soberly, charitably and without fear the means of establishing peace, and to ask the guidance and blessing of the Father of All upon our efforts.



We seek an end to war in Korea and its prevention anywhere else in the world.

RABBI ABBA HILLEL SILVER addressing an open letter to President Truman at the height of the Korean War, reminded him that "negotiation is not appearement." He urged that efforts be made to reach agreement around the Council Table to bring an end to the slaughter.

THERE MUST BE AN END TO THE MYTH that with the sword we cut the path to peace. While war prevails in Korea, in other parts of the world there is preparation for more slaughter. In Western Germany, Nazis responsible for the extermination of six million Jews are being elevated to high policy positions in the program to rearm Germany. Can we rest easily with this knowledge?

CAN THE YOUNG STATE OF ISRAEL survive a Third World War? Israel, center of the Near East Unrest, born in the struggle for freedom out of the death of millions, can Israel survive such a blood bath?

SHALOM! PEACE IN KOREA is the first barrier against the tide of war which threatens the world. For these reasons, we of the Interfaith Committee make this plea to the Jewish people at this solemn season of the "Yamim Noraim." when we usher in a New Year and face the future with hope for a better, peaceful world. 

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have the honor to invite you to speak at a public meeting on June 3 in New York City around the theme of the aspirations of colonial peoples for independence.

As you know, the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions is an organization of educators, writers, artists, musicians, physicians, scientists and other professionals devoted to a democratic culture, peace, and civil liberties for all. Our Council, long concerned with international understanding and the maintenance of peace, feels that no lasting settlement among the major powers can be arrived at unless it takes account of the needs of the people in the dependencies and colonies, for independence and higher standards of living. Developments during the last few years in Asia, Africa and the Middle East have underscored this.

We are not sure that the American people fully appreciate the significance of the historical upsurge for freedom of the colonial, and that means in most cases Colored, peoples of the world.

For our part we cannot agree with the position taken by our representatives in the United Nations to deny a hearing of the Tunisian question before the Security Council. Hence we are supporting Congressman Armstrong's Resolution 211 in the House, calling for a reversal of the vote. We have asked Representative Armstrong whether his Congressional duties will permit him to speak at this meeting.

The experience of the struggle for independence of Israel, is certainly germane to the general question. Through your first hand knowledge of Israel and the Middle East, your views would be very important to such a discussion.

It would be most gratifying if you could participate and speak on any aspect of the general topic which you choose. Would you be good enough to let me know your answer at your earliest convenience.
