VIA AIR MAIL SPECIAL DELIVERY It is my great pleasure to join with you tonight in saying farewell to Ambassador Eban. He has been the Israeli Ambassador to our country for nearly nine years. He is now returning to Israel to continue, in another capacity, his remarkable career of public service and statesmanship. We say farewell to him only as the needs of Israel have summoned him away from us to other needs and duties within the same orbit wherein he has so brilliantly distinguished himself.

Ambassador Eban was sent to the United States to represent a small country which was perilously situated at the political cross-roads of world power-blocs, and which was hemmed in by irreconcilable enemies. All things had to be improvised by the new State of Israel, including the very men whom it sent forth as its ministers and ambassadors. They, in turn, had to extemporize their own techniques and skills, for they were not long-term experienced diplomats.

Abbs Eban was sent to the most important post in the foreign service of his country - to Washington. His critical task was to mount guard for the safety of Israelin the early and dangerous years when lack of vigilance might have proven disastrous, to hold on to gains already made, and to advance its interests still farther.

His mission was to win friends for Israel, not only in government circles - but among the people of our country non-Jews and Jews alike. The good-will of the American people was of paramount importance to Israel - as it still is - and that good-will was constantly being undermined by hostile propoganda enamating from many sources.

That Ambassador Eban succeeded to a remarkable degree is due, of course, to the rare endowments of his mind and heart. He brought to his task judgment, courage and dignity. He knew how to plead vithout begging, and how to hold a banner high without flaunting it. He was aware, at all times, that he represented a small country and that the political weapons at his command were sharply limited. But he was also, at all times, aware that he was the designated spokesman of a great, historic people, and of an imperishable, sovereign, moral cause. And so he spoke with confidence and authority - and with the power of enkindling speech. True eloquence is logic on fire. To have music in your speech you must have harmony in your thoughts. We thank Abba Eban for having brought to us the proud song of Israel's rebirth, the song of the new land and its new hopes, and we are grateful that something of its rythm and melody has come to abide permanently in our own hearts.

In our traditional High Holy Day service, there is a special personal prayer prescribed for the Chazan - "the representative of the people". The prayer reads: " May those who have designated me not be disappointed in me, and my I not be disappointed in them".

Need we assure Ambassador Eban, the representative of Israel and our spokesman, that we have not been disappointed in him? I believe, too, that he has every reason to feel that we have not disappointed him.

COPY OF FAREHELL ADDRESS TO AMBASSADON ABBA EBAN GIVEN BY DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER AT MADISON SCUARE GARDENS NEW YORK CITH on May 14, 1959. It is my great pleasure that I im for the present of for the hold to Ambassador Eban. He has been the Israeli Ambassador to our country for hearly nine years. He is now returning to Israel to continue, in another capacity, his remarkable career of public service and statesmanship. We say farewell to him only as the needs of Israel have summoned him away from us to other needs and duties within the same orbit wherein he has so brilliantly distinguished bimself.

Ambassador Eban was sent to the United States to represent a small country which is perilously situated at the political cross-roads of world powet-blocs, and which the hermed in by irreconcilable enemies. All things had to be improvised by the new State of Israel, including the very men whom it sent forth as its ministers and ambassadors. They, in turn, had to extemporize their own techniques and skills for they were not long-term experienced diplomats.

Abba Eban was sent to the most important post in the foreign service of his country - to Washington. His critical task was to mount guard for the safety of Israel in the early and dangerous years when lack of vigilance might have proven disastrous, to hold on to gains already made, and to advance its interests still farther.

His mission was to win friends for Israel, not only in government circles - but among the people of our country - non-Jews and Jews alike. The good-will of the American people was of paramount importance to Israel as it still is - and that good-will was constantly being and amgered by hostile propoganda emanating from many sources.

That Ambassador Eban succeeded to a remarkable degree is due, of course, to the rare endowments of his mind and heart. He brought to his task judgment, courage and dignity. He knew how to plead without begging and how to hold a banner high without flaunting it. He was aware, at all times, that he represented a small country and that the political weapons at his command were sharply limited. But he was also, at all times, aware that he was the spokesman of a great, historic people, and of an imperishable, soverign moral cause.

And so he spoke with confidence and authority - and with the power of enkindling speech. True eloquence is logic on fire. To have music in your speech you must have harmony in your thoughts.
