

Dear Abba:

The Synagogue Council of the East Bay, comprizing all the Temples in our area, orthodox, conservative and reform, sponsors each year an Annual Lectureship. We have had as our guests, thus far, Prof. Mordecai Kaplan, Dr. Robert Gordis and Prof. Harry M. Orlinsky. The format followed is for the Lecturer to speak in our Temple on Friday evening and Saturday in another Temple and Sunday in still another, thus giving three lectures. This year, the San Francisco Board of Rabbis asked if their community might not have the privilege of hearing our guest and so it was agreed that we would ask him to speak to us twice and once in San Francisco.
