My dear Rabbi Silver:-

I do not know whether you have ever been to Ohio Wesleyan or not. We should like very much for you to come and address our chapel service. This comes five days in the week at 11:10 and lasts until 11:35. That means that a speaker would have about 18 minutes at the outside for an address.

We are exceedingly anxious to have you here. I know it is asking a great deal of you to spend a day coming to an institution as far away from Cleveland as we are. I also regret greatly to ask you to come when all we can promise is the payment of your expenses. We are hard put to it as many institutions are. We are trying, however, in every way possible to give the inspiration of leaders from off the campus to our student body of something over 1300 students.

I am not fixing a definite date but I am wondering whether you might mention certain dates on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday of any week between the middle of October and Thanksgiving time. We are only beginning to make dates with outside speakers and could quite easily fit into your plan.

I am also sure that quite a group would want to be with you for lunch after our chapel in order to come more closely in contact with you. It would be a very great inspiration to us if you could be with us this fall.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I was delighted to get your wire and know that you are going to be able to come to speak to us on Saturday, November 27.

There is a train which leaves Cleveland about 8 a.m. (railroad time), 7:00 a.m. (Ohio time) reaching here two hours and one half later. We will meet that train.

I should like to tell you a little about the meeting. It is to inaugurate our war fund drive, but we are not asking you to make any appeal for money. What we want rather is something which will make vivid to our students the situation in the world and our responsibility for it. I think I told you that we will be having not only 800 civilian students but also a thousand navy men. The gravest problem that we face is the lack of any realization of any clear purpose in the war. Because they do not see what is involved or how desperate the need. This is our one chance through the year to give them something of that realization.

Unfortunately the time is limited and you will not have over 30 minutes. But I am sure that you can do for us in that time what we want.

Will you ask your secretary to drop me a card so that I can be sure that these arrangements are understood. Thank you again and looking forward to your visit, I am,

Dear Rabbi Silver:

This letter is to open negotiations which I hope will culminate in a visit by you to Ohio Wesleyan University. We have often spoken of our wish that you could speak to our students, and I hope that this can be made possible for this year.

My invitation is a double-barreled one. First of all, we would like to have you speak to our entire student body - some 2,000 students, at a regular Wednesday morning chapel at 11:00 a.m. The entire program lasts about thirty minutes, and you would have a full twenty minutes of this time.

In the second place, I would like very much to have you meet on the preceding Tuesday evening with a small seminar of mine in "Problems of Religious Philosophy." At that time I would want you to present to the group the central features of Hebrew Religious Philosophy. I am thinking of this as a systematic statement, rather than as a historical statement.

The dates that would best fit our program are Tuesday and Wednesday, March 2 - 3, or March 16 - 17. If these dates are not convenient, perhaps you can suggest some other time between the middle of February and the middle of May. Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver - 2.

If you could come for these two sessions, there would be an honorarium of \$75.00, and we would provide for your local entertainment.

I shall look forward to an early reply, and I hope that it will be in the affirmative.
