November 1, 1949 Mr. Joseph Weinberg Zionist Organization of France 47, rue de Chabrol Paris 10, France My dear Mr. Weinberg: I deeply appreciate your telegram as well as your letter of October 28th in which you invite me to attend the National Conference of the Zionist Organization of France to be held in Paris on November 26th through the 28th, 1949. I need not tell you that I feel greatly honored at the invitation which you extend to me, and were I free to come, I should have been most happy for I recall with much pleasure the moving reception which the Zionists of France gave me in 1948, and the many manifestations of friendship on all sides. They remain with me as treasured memories. Unfortunately, I have already committed myself to important meetings during that week in the United States. I am, for example, to be the guest and speaker at a banquet of the New York City Zionists to be held on November 29th. The meeting has been announced for some time now and it is being built around my attendance. I also have a meeting earlier that week in my own community. I trust that your Conference will be eminently successful. Please convey to all the delegates my warmest greetings. Great and historic achievements lie behind us. Great and historic challenges for the future like ahead of us. The State of Israel must be made politically secure and economically prosperous. The myriads who are pouring into the country must be helped to be integrated within the economic life of the new nation. Relaxation in alertness and effort either on the political or the economic field is fraught with grave dangers. I salute all our Zionist friends in France on the occasion of the Second Anniversary of the United Nations' decision to which the glorious Republic of France made a most significant contribution.
